STATEMENT OF THE FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES CONSTITUTING THE EMERGENCIES REQUIRING TEMPORARY REGULATION XIX-TT

This regulation sets forth requirements for pre-construction review and determination of emission offsets for proposed new or modified stationary sources of air pollutants intending to locate in areas with air quality worse than the level set to protect the public health and welfare, or in areas that might impact those areas.

Regulation XIX-TT is required by the Clean Air Act of 1977, as amended, to be in place no later than July 1, 1979. In granting continued State Implementation Plan approval by the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to said act, the Environmental Protection Agency allowed the State of West Virginia to have in place a temporary or emergency regulation while rule making proceeded for a permanent regulation. Regulation XIX-TT is identical to the permanent Regulation XIX as adopted by the Commission on the 11th day of August, 1982.
