2.08. No person shall permit any dog owned by him or under his control to chase, pursue or follow upon the track of any wild animal or wild bird, either day or night, between the first day of May and the fifteenth day of August next following, except as authorized in the Code of West Virginia, §20-2-56.

SECTION 3. HUNTING SEASONS

3.01. Deer Firearms season - Bucks only - First Monday preceding Thanksgiving for 13 consecutive days in the following counties: Barbour, Berkeley, Boone, Braxton, Brooke, Cabell, Calhoun, Clay, Doddridge, Fayette, Gilmer, Grant, Greenbrier, Hampshire, Hancock, Hardy, Harrison, Jackson, Jefferson, Kanawha, Lewis, Lincoln, Marion, Marshall, Mason, Mercer, Mineral, Monongalia, Monroe, Morgan, Nicholas, Ohio, Pendleton, Pleasants, Pocahontas, Preston, Pubnam, Raleigh, Randolph, Ritchie, Roane, Summers, Taylor, Tucker, Tyler, Upshur, Wayne, Webster, Wetzel, Wirt and Wood.

No buck-only firearm deer season in McDowell, Logan, Wyoming and Mingo counties.

(A) No person may legally take under any condition more than three deer per calendar year: one by bow during the archery season; one by gun or bow during the bucks-only season; or one by muzzle-loader if not taken by gun during the regular firearms season; and one
