### SERIES 25B 26 SPECIAL BOATING REGULATIONS RULES

### §4758-25B26-1. General.

- 1.1. Scope and Purpose. -- These This rules provide interpretations and guidance concerning special regulations that govern the operation of motorboats and other vessels on particular waters of this State.
- 1.2. Authority. -- W. Va. Code \$20-1-7(30), \$20-7-22, and \$20-7-23.

#### §<del>47</del>58-<del>25</del>B26-2. Definitions.

- 2.1. "Director" means the director of the West Virginia Department Division of Natural Resources.
- 2.2. Government-Owned Reservoir" means any natural or artificial impoundment, lake, pond, or reservoir that is partially or wholly within the territorial limits of West Virginia and is owned or administered by the federal government or by the State or any political subdivision thereof of the state.
- 2.3. "Motorboat" means any vessel propelled by an electrical, steam, gasoline, diesel, or other fuel-propelled or drive motor, whether or not such motor is the principal source of propulsion, but shall not include a vessel which has a valid marine document issued by the Bureau of Customs of the United States government or any federal agency successor thereto.
- 2.4. "Special Regulations Rules" means rules and regulations to be observed in the operation or navigation of motorboats and other vessels upon, over, or through the waters of a particular

government-owned reservoir which the director deems considers necessary for the public health or safety of persons or property on or in such those waters, or for the preservation of useful aquatic life. Special regulations rules supplement the provisions of Article 7 of Chapter 20 of the West Virginia Code 20-7-1 et.seq., and the general rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, as they relate to motorboats and other vessels by further limiting, restricting, or prohibiting the operation or navigation of such the vessels on a particular government-owned reservoir.

### §47<u>58</u>-25<u>B26</u>-3. Special Regulations Rules for Government-owned Reservoirs Lakes.

- 3.1. Airport Pond (Raleigh County): No boating allowed.
- 3.2. Anawalt (McDowell County): No boating allowed.
- 3.13. Anderson (Kanawha County): No boating allowed.
- 3.24. Athens (Mercer County): Electric motors only.

  Barboursville (Cabell County): No boating allowed.
- 3.35. Bear Rocks (Ohio County): Electric motors only.
- 3.46. Beech Fork (Wayne County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
  - 3.57. Berwind (McDowell County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.68. Big Ditch (Webster County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.72. Big Run (Marion County): Electric motors only.
- $3.8\underline{10}$ . Bluestone (Summers County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones and speed limit zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.

- 3.1012. Brandywine (Pendleton County): Electric motors only.
- 3.1113. Brushy Fork (Site 19) (Pendleton County): Electric motors only.
- 3.1214. Buffalo Fork (Pocahontas County): Electric motors only.
- $3.\overline{1315}$ . Burches Run (Marshall County): Electric motors only.
- 3.1416. Burnsville (Braxton County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
  - 3.1517. Cacapon (Morgan County): No motorboats allowed.
  - 3.1618. Camp Run (Pendleton County): Electric motors only.
- $3.\overline{1719}$ . Castleman Run (Brooke and Ohio Counties): Electric motors only.
  - 3.1820. Cedar Creek (Gilmer County): No boating allowed.
  - 3.1921. Charles Fork (Roane County): Electric motors only.
- 3.2022. Cheat (Monongalia County): No restrictions. Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs which are approved by the Director. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by such approved buoys or posted signs.
- 3.2123. Chief Cornstalk (Mason County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.2224. Chief Logan (Logan County): No boating allowed.
  - 3.2325. Conaway Run (Tyler County): Electric motors only.

- 3.2426. Coopers Rock (Monongalia County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.2527. Curtisville (Marion County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.28 Dal-Tex (Logan County): Electric motors only.
- 3.2629. Doe Run Sub-Impoundment (Taylor County): Electric motors only.

- 3.2832. East Lynn (Wayne County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.

- 3.3034. Elk Two Mile (Site 12) (Kanawha County): No boating allowed.

  - 3.37. Flat Run (Marion County): Electric motors only.

  - 3.3540. French Creek (Upshur County): No boating allowed.
- 3.41. Frozencamp Left Fork (Jackson County): Electric motors only.

- 3.5366. Moncove (Monroe County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of five (5) horsepower.
- $3.54\underline{67}$ . Mount Storm (Grant County): Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.

- 3.5669. New Creek (Dam Number 14) (Grant County): No boating allowed.
- 3.57. New Martinsville (Wetzel County): No boating
  - 3.5870. North Bend (Ritchie County): No boating allowed.
- 3.5971. O'Brien (Site 13) (Jackson County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe nowake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake.
  - 3.60. Ona (Cabell County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.6172. Pennsboro (Ritchie County): Electric motors only.

- 3.62. -Pinnacle (Mercer County): Electric motors only.
- 3.6373. Pipestem (Summers County): Rental boats only.
- 3.6474. Plum Orchard (Fayette County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Only motorboats powered by electric motors are allowed within zones marked by barrels.
- 3.65. Pocatalico (Site 28) (Jackson County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe no wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs.
- 3.6675. R. D. Bailey (Mingo and Wyoming Counties): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
  - 3.6776. Ridenour (Kanawha County): No boating allowed.
  - 3.68 77. Rock Cliff (Hardy County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.6978. Rollins (Jackson County): Electric motors only.

- 3.7787. Stonecoal (Lewis and Upshur Counties): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. No waterskiing allowed. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake.
- 3.7888. Stonewall Jackson (Lewis County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
- 3.7989. Summersville (Nicholas County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
  - 3.8090. Summit (Greenbrier County): Electric motors only.
- 3.8191. Sutton (Braxton County): Motorboats must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
  - 3.8292. Teter Creek (Barbour County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.8393. Thomas Park (Tucker County): Electric motors only.
- 3.8494. Tomlinson Run (Hancock County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.8595. Tracy (Ritchie County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.8696. Trout (Hardy County): No motorboats allowed.
  - 3.97. Tuckahoe (Greenbrier County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.8798. Turkey Run (Jackson County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.8899. Turkey Run (Marshall County): Electric motors only.

- 3.89100. Tygart (Taylor County): Motorboats must observe nowake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Motorboats and other vessels may not enter restricted areas marked by buoys or posted signs.
- 3.90101. Tygart River Backwaters (Town of Elkins) (Randolph County): Electric motors only.
- 3.102. Upper Mud River (Lincoln County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe nowake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake.
- 3.103. Wallback (Clay and Roane Counties): Electric motors only.
  - 3.91104. Warden (Hardy County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.92105. Watoga (Pocahontas County): Electric motors only.
- 3.93106. Westover Park (Monongalia County): No boating allowed.
  - 3.107. Whetstone (Marion County): Electric motors only.
  - 3.94108. Wolf Run (Marshall County): Electric motors only.
- 3.109. Woodrum (Jackson County): Motorboats are limited to a maximum of ten (10) horsepower and must observe no-wake zones marked by buoys or posted signs. Boats having motors greater than ten (10) horsepower must have the propeller removed while operating on this lake.

### §4758-25B26-4. Special Regulations for Class A Motorboats.

4.1. Motorboats of Class A must be equipped with the lights required for motorboats of Class 1 in accordance with the Division of Natural Resources Boating Rules, 47 58 C.S.R. 25 §4.1.5. whenever operated on one of the following bodies of water:

- 4.1.1. Beech Fork Lake;
- 4.1.2. Bluestone Lake;
- 4.1.3. Burnsville Lake;
- 4.1.4. Cheat Lake;
- 4.1.5. East Lynn Lake;
- 4.1.6. Jennings Randolph Lake;
- 4.1.7. Kanawha River;
- 4.1.8. Monongahela River;
- 4.1.9. Ohio River;
- 4.1.10. R. D. Bailey Lake;
- 4.1.11. Stonecoal Lake;
- 4.1.12. Stonewall Jackson Lake;
- 4.1.13. Summersville Lake;
- 4.1.14. Sutton Lake; and
- 4.1.15. Tygart Lake.
