

SERIES 9 ELIMINATION OF PRECINCT REGISTRATION BOOKS

§153-9-1. General.

- 1.1. Scope. This rule provides for implementation of state law relating to the maintenance of state voter registration records.
 - 1.2. Authority. W.Va. Code §3-2-21.
 - 1.3. Filing Date. -
 - 1.4. Effective Date. -

§153-9-2. Definitions.

This section defines terms used in this rule.

- 2.1. "State Uniform Data System" means a uniform software program and system of digitized electronic storage of voter registration records.
- 2.2. "Precinct Registration Books" means the hard-cover books which contain the official voter registration records of the voters in a specific precinct.
- 2.3. "Precinct Voter Records" means the computer generated official record of voter registration information of the voters in a specific precinct.
 - 2.4. "Voter Registration Records" means the official records of voter information.

§153-9-3. Elimination of separate precinct registration books.

This section establishes a means for eliminating precinct registration books.

- 3.1. The elimination of precinct registrations books may be accomplished only after a county has officially adopted the State Uniform Data System.
- 3.2. The State Uniform Data System must contain the following information for each voter:
 - 3.2.1. first, middle and last name; and,

- 3.2.2. residence address including city, county, number and street or RFD and zip code number; and,
 - 3.2.3. mailing address, if any; and,
 - 3.2.4. date of birth; and,
 - 3.2.5. gender; and,
 - 3.2.6. last four numbers of social security number; and,
 - 3.2.7. party affiliation; and,
 - 3.2.8. registration number; and,
 - 3.2.9. precinct number; and,
 - 3.2.10. date of registration; and,
 - 3.2.11. record of name, address and party changes; and,
 - 3.2.12. voting record.
- 3.3. When the State Uniform Voter Data System is adopted and is in successful use, the county clerk may apply to the secretary of state in writing to eliminate the use of precinct registration books. The written request shall include:
- 3.3.1. the vendor and the name of the State Uniform Voter Data software used by the county; and,
- 3.3.2. a certified copy of an actual voter data record which includes the information detailed in 3.2.
- 3.4. State Uniform Voter Data System voter records may be used as precinct registration records after their approval by the secretary of state.

I am in full support of the elimination of the Precinct Books for the following reasons:

- 1. The books are old causing them to fall apart and we cannot purchase new ones.
- 2. Most of the books that we have are very heavy making it very hard for someone to lift, especially an elderly poll worker.
- 3. As our paper records keep growing, space is a big issue for us. We currently have 155 books and plan to expand very soon with additional precincts.
- 4. It seems that every election we have to correct the "voting marks" made in the wrong election box on the cards in the Precinct Books.
- 5. The Poll Workers feel obligated to change information on the Voter Record, therefore we have to review and correct.
- 6. Process time on each voter will be improved tremendously. With the Precinct Books gone, we will no longer have to pull the registration card to correct/update therefore reducing process time on each voter.
- 7. Poll Worker supply pick-up will be greatly reduced. At election time, when the Poll Worker picks up his/her supplies, there will be no Precinct Books to carry/tote reducing their load greatly.
- 8. After each election, in order to check the Precinct Books for correct voting marks, we must alphabetize over 30,000 poll slips.
