EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 6-18

By the Governor

EXECUTIVE ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of West Virginia, do hereby **ORDER** that:

1. The Task Force on Public Employee Insurance Agency Stability (the "Task Force") is hereby constituted.
2. The Task Force shall consist of the individuals identified in this Executive Order, who shall serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor. The members of the Task Force may only designate individuals to serve in their place with the express written consent of the Governor.
3. Members of the Task Force shall be individuals who have education, experience, and practical knowledge regarding the Public Employees Insurance Agency, its financial stability, its participation and the public insurance industry, as follows:

(a) The Governor's Chief of Staff, who shall serve as Chair of the Task Force.

(b) One current member of the Board of the Public Employees Insurance Agency.

(c) Three (3) members of the State Senate, with two of the three members being of the Republican Party and one member of the three being of the Democratic Party, designated by the Senate President.

(c) Three (3) members of the House of Delegates, with two of the three members being of the Republican Party and one member of the three being of the Democratic Party, designated by the Speaker of the House of Delegates;

(d) A Representative of the West Virginia Federation of Teachers;

(e) A Representative of the West Virginia Education Association;

(f) A Representative of the West Virginia School Service Personnel Association;

(g) Five (5) members who shall serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor and shall be appointed by the Governor, as follows:

(1) Three (3) West Virginia full-time public employees, after consultation with the various public employee associations;

(2) Two (2) West Virginia retired public employees, with one retired public employee being a retired education employee and one retired employee being a retired state employee.

WHEREAS, West Virginia is blessed with education, school service personnel, and public employees who are committed to their students and their state; and

WHEREAS, the Public Employees Insurance Agency is an employment benefit that is of the utmost importance to West Virginia educators, school service personnel, public employees and to the State of West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the long-term financial stability and health of the Public Employees Insurance Agency has been a substantial concern to West Virginia educators, school service personnel and public employees for a long time; and

WHEREAS, the preservation of the long-term financial stability of Public Employees Insurance Agency cannot be accomplished immediately, but requires a thorough and complete study; and

WHEREAS, West Virginia educators, service personnel, and public employees deserve an opportunity to have input and be heard during this thorough and complete study; and

WHEREAS, stakeholder participation in the study is essential to a position and beneficial study; and

WHEREAS, the health and welfare of West Virginia educators, service personnel and public employees is of paramount concern to Governor Jim Justice;

- (b) Seven (7) members as the Governor, at his discretion, may appoint, having particular knowledge and expertise of the insurance industry and business.
4. The Task Force shall review, study and assess the current state of the Public Employment Insurance Agency as provided in PSLA records, including but not limited to:

EXECUTIVE ORDER

- (a) The current insurance plan provided to employees.
 - (b) The premium paid by employees and their families.
 - (c) The current state of plan coverage, reductions, exclusions, expirations and renewal costs.
 - (d) Current and reduce medical costs.
 - (e) Market analysis and trends of coverage.
 - (f) Economics faced through effectiveness, and
 - (g) Anything else the Task Force deems necessary to provide a thorough evaluation in preparation of its report.
5. The Task Force shall also solicit public input from West Virginia state employees, their families, and West Virginia public retirement, by coordinating public hearings in all Fifty (50) counties:
 - (a) These public hearings shall be at times and locations consistent to the public employees, their families and public employee retirees may attend.
 - (b) Public employees and retirees will be provided an opportunity to ask questions and provide input to the members of the Task Force.
 6. The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it deems necessary and convenient to carry out the requirements of this Executive Order.
 7. After obtaining input from public employees and public retirees, the Task Force shall provide a report of the findings and recommendations of the Task Force for a long-term financial stability plan for the Public Employment Insurance Agency.
 8. The Task Force shall hold its organizational meeting on or before March 15, 2018.
 9. The Task Force shall prepare and issue a final report prior to the December 2018 interim meetings of the West Virginia Legislature, advising of its findings and recommendations.
 10. The Report of the Task Force's findings and recommendations shall be submitted to the Governor, and the Joint Committee on Government and Finance.

11. The Report of the Task Force shall be finalized prior to Public Employment Insurance Agency's 2020 Fiscal Year Plan submit.
12. Staff support and facilitation for the Task Force shall be provided by the West Virginia Governor's Office.
13. Reimbursement for Task Force travel expenses may be made from the budget of the Governor's Office.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 7-18

By the Governor

WHEREAS, West Virginia recognizes the growing threat to the State by drug abuse, street gangs, terrorism, and other groups and individuals who bear at the fabric of a safe and secure State;

AND

WHEREAS, West Virginia also realizes the continued problems associated with both natural and man-made disasters and that such problems are best served through cooperation and sharing information and resources; and

WHEREAS, West Virginia understands that the tragic events of September 11, 2001, were, at least in part, possible because of a lack of cooperation among and between governmental agencies and because of the lack of sharing of pertinent and relevant information between departments; and

WHEREAS, West Virginia recognizes that the most efficient and effective way of dealing with and preventing such problems is through cooperation among and between the various organizations; the proper and immediate analysis of vital information and the proper distribution of actionable intelligence; and

WHEREAS, since March 15, 2008, the Governor has established the West Virginia Intelligence Fusion Center as the designated Intelligence Fusion Center for the State of West Virginia.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of West Virginia, do hereby **DECLARE and ORDER** as follows:

1. That the West Virginia Intelligence Fusion Center shall be the primary clearing house for the State of West Virginia for the collection of, the analysis of, and the proper distribution of information and actionable intelligence for the State.

2. That the fusion center shall collect, analyze, disseminate, and properly maintain such information to support law-enforcement agencies, other governmental agencies, and private organizations in preventing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from critical safety, hazardous situations, personal threats and terrorist-related activity.

3. That all state agencies are encouraged to cooperate with each other as active part of the West Virginia Intelligence Fusion Center efforts in order to aid in the collection of and dissemination of information that will better serve the people and property of the State of West Virginia and in the besting public in the preventing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from criminal, hazardous, terror and terrorist-related activity.

4. That, for the purpose of collection of information, and for the vetting of, analyzing of, and proper dissemination of actionable intelligence, the West Virginia Intelligence Fusion Center shall be recognized as a criminal justice entity.

5. That the West Virginia Intelligence Fusion Center shall establish partnerships between law enforcement agencies, state agencies, private sector partners, critical infrastructure leaders, and the citizens of West Virginia as well as other States and their citizens in an effort to collect, analyze, vet, and properly disseminate actionable intelligence needed in order to develop and maintain a safe, hospitable environment to live in, travel in, and in which to create business.
