#### Statement of Circumstances Which Require the Proposed Rule

Not since 1999 has the Board of Medicine requested a fee increase by which to financially support its operations, mission and responsibilities required by the Legislature. During the past decade, operating costs have substantially increased, particularly in the area of personnel benefits which have risen 36% in this period of time. Salaries have likewise increased by 33%, however remain very far below the market rate for comparable positions making it necessary for 25% of the staff to hold second jobs to make ends meet.

Costs of office supplies and equipment, computer equipment, postage, etc., upon which the Board of Medicine heavily relies, have also increased during this past 10 years.

During this time period, revenues have remained neutral as costs continued to climb. By way of enhanced efficiencies and information technology, the Board of Medicine has done a formidable job at containing these costs. Despite these efforts, the economics of increased costs and neutral revenues over such a period of time must be realized.

The Office of Legislative Auditor defines, in part, the fiscal viability of a state board as having an adequate financial reserve rolling over from one year to the next that is comparable to 100% of the expenditures of that board for one year. This amount is viewed as necessary in the event of unforeseen fiscal events that would threaten the viability or solvency of the board, such as uncovered liability, litigation, theft, etc.

The current Board of Medicine reserve has dropped to 41% which will be noted in the Performance Evaluation audit by the Office of Legislative Auditor scheduled for 2010.

Secondly, the Board of Medicine has recognized the newly formed physician health program as having a valuable contribution to the safety of public health care by assisting medical professionals in their recovery from drug addiction and abuse and mental illness. The legislature enacted the law authorizing this program in 2007.

The Board of Medicine has voted to provide a degree of financial support to the physician health program with which the Board holds an agreement through an increase in its fees. The Board, as one of several stakeholders of this program, believes such support is a necessary and responsible action to assist in this program becoming and remaining financially solvent.

Fifty percent (50%) of the fee increase for physicians and podiatrists requested in the proposed rule would be disbursed to this program while the remaining 50% would be utilized by the Board of Medicine to support it operation, mission and responsibilities required by the Legislature.

The new fee reflected in the proposed rule for the physician assistants is a fee for the physician health program. All other fees for physician assistants remain unchanged and are in West Virginia Code §30-3-16 at this time; however it is appropriate that they be included in this rule.

Because of this disbursement to the physician health program, please note that actual revenue increase which the board will directly realize is only half of what was requested in 1999.
