Chapter 17A-2 Series XVI 1985

Subject: Eligibility For Reinstatement Following Suspension or Revocation of Driving Privileges

Section 1. General

- 1.01. Scope These legislative rules relate to the policy of the Department of Motor Vehicles in determination of eligibility for reinstatement following suspension or revocation of driving privileges by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.
- 1.02. Authority These emergency legislative rules are issued under the authority of \$17A-2-9.
- 1.03. Filing Date These emergency legislative rules were filed on April 17, 1985.
- 1.04. Effective Date These emergency legislative rules become effective April 17, 1985.

Section 2. Application and Enforcement

- 2.01. Application These legislative rules apply to any person making application for reinstatement of a drivers license following suspension or revocation of driving privileges by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.
- 2.02. Enforcement Enforcement of these legislative rules is vested with the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles or lawful designee.

Section 3. Suspension or Revocation of Driving Privileges

3.01. Surrender - Any person whose driving privileges have been

suspended or revoked by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall surrender all operator's and chauffeur's licenses in their possession pursuant to the provisions of the suspension or revocation order entered.

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- 3.02. Failure to Surrender The Commissioner shall proceed pursuant to \$17B-3-9 against any person who fails to comply with the terms of the suspension or revocation order directed to them.
- 3.03. Effective Date The effective date of suspension or revocation of driving privileges shall be the date as listed in the suspension or revocation order entered. All provisions of §17B-4-3 shall apply after the effective date of suspension or revocation.

Section 4: Eligibility for Reinstatement

- 4.01. Period of Suspension or Revocation All time periods provided in the West Virginia Code for eligibility for reinstatement of a drivers license shall be calculated from the date of receipt by the Commissioner of #11 operator's and chauffeur's licenses pursuant to the suspension or revocation order entered.
- 4.02. Lost or Destroyed Operator's or Chauffeur's Licenses The provisions of \$17B-2-9 require that every licensee have his operator's or chauffeur's license in his immediate possession at all times when operating a motor vehicle. Any person who is unable to surrender their operator's or chauffeur's license because it has been lost or destroyed shall submit a sworn affidavit stating that the operator's or chauffeur's license has been lost or destroyed. The affidavit shall be held by the Commissioner in lieu of the actual operator's or chauffeur's license. Provided, that any person making a

false affidavit shall, pursuant to the provisions of \$17B-4-2 be guilty of perjury.

4.03. Expired License - The provisions of \$178-2-1 require that any person operating a motor vehicle have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license. Any person whose operator's or chauffeur's license expires after his driving privileges have been suspended or revoked, and who has failed to comply with the provisions of the order of suspension or revocation by surrendering such license to the Commissioner, shall have his eligibility for reinstatement calculated from the date of the expiration of the license.
