

§47-11I-1. General.

1.1. Scope and Purpose. -- The purpose of these regulations is to establish standards to be complied with when training dogs within the boundaries of this State.

1.2. Authority. -- West Virginia Code §20-1-7(30).

1.3. Filing Date. --

1.4. Effective Date. --

§47-11I-2. Definitions.

2.1. All terms shall have the meanings prescribed to them in Title 47, Series 11A (47 C.S.R. 11A).

§47-11I-3. Dog Training Rules.

3.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of W. Va. Code §20-2-5(26), residents of the State of Ohio may train their dogs in this state between the 16th day of August and the 30th day of April, but may not train a dog in any bear county, or parts thereof, in which a legal bear hunting season has been established prior to July 1, 1988, except during the small game hunting season.
