**CIRCUMSTANCE AND SUMMARY FOR EXEMPT RULE
CONCERNING WATERFOWL HUNTING**

AGENCY: Bureau of Commerce, Division of Natural Resources

REGULATION: Title 58, Series 57, Waterfowl Hunting Rule

SUMMARY: Series 57 revises the current Waterfowl Hunting Regulations. This rule prescribes the open seasons and the bag, size, age, weight and sex limits with respect to the hunting of waterfowl in West Virginia. The rule will become effective September 1, 2000.

CIRCUMSTANCE: Regulation changes are in compliance with federal guidelines on waterfowl seasons, dates and bag limits and control the number of waterfowl taken and the density of waterfowl hunters in certain areas.

§58-57-1. General.

- 1.1. Scope. -- This regulation establishes the open seasons and the bag, size, age, weight, and sex limits for the hunting of waterfowl in West Virginia.
- 1.2. Authority. -- W. Va. Code §§29A-1-3(c) and 20-1- 17(7).
- 1.3. Filing Date. -- August 25, 2000
- 1.4. Effective Date. -- September 1, 2000
- 1.5. Seasons in General. -- All seasons are subject to change under the provisions of W. Va. Code §20-1-7(7). Opening and closing dates are inclusive and the time periods are prevailing time unless otherwise noted in these regulations. Sunday hunting is illegal.

§58-57-2. Definitions.

- 2.1. All terms shall have the meanings prescribed in the Code of State Regulations, Title 58, Series 58 "Special Waterfowl Hunting Regulations" (58 C.S.R. 58).

§58-57-3. General Provisions.

- 3.1. Closed Season - No person may take waterfowl during the closed season.
- 3.2. Shooting or Falconry Hours - No person may take waterfowl except during the hours open to shooting or falconry as prescribed in these regulations.
- 3.3. Daily Bag Limit - No person may take more than the daily bag limit of any waterfowl.
- 3.4. Field Possession Limit - No person may possess more than the daily bag limit of any waterfowl while in the field or while returning from the field to one's car, hunting camp, home, or other place.
- 3.5. Wanton Waste - All waterfowl killed or crippled must be retrieved if possible and retained in the custody of the hunter in the field.
- 3.6. Custody of Birds of Another - No person may receive or have in his/her custody

waterfowl belonging to another person unless such birds are properly tagged.

3.7. Possession of Live Birds - No person may at any time, or by any means, possess or transport live waterfowl taken under 50 C.F.R. Part 20 or under these regulations. Wounded birds reduced to possession must be immediately killed and included in the daily bag limit.

§58-57-4. Open Shooting and Falconry Seasons.

4.1. Duck Seasons.

4.1.1. Zone 1 Duck Season.

4.1.1.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~, ~~1999~~2000.

4.1.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November ~~29~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 20, 2000~~1~~.

4.1.2. Zone 2 Duck Season.

4.1.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~, ~~1999~~2000.

4.1.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on November ~~17~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January ~~8~~, 2000~~1~~.

4.1.3. There is no open season for harlequin ducks., scoters, eiders, whistling ducks, or mottled ducks.

4.2. Merganser Seasons.

4.2.1. Zone 1 Merganser Season.

4.2.1.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~, ~~1999~~2000.

4.2.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November ~~29~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 20, 2000~~1~~.

4.2.2. Zone 2 Merganser Season.

4.2.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~, ~~1999~~2000.

4.2.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on November 173, 19992000 and closes on January 86, 20001.

4.3. Coot Seasons.

4.3.1. Zone 1 Coot Season.

4.3.1.a. The first segment of this season opens October 12, 19992000 and closes on October 164, 19992000.

4.3.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November 297, 19992000 and closes on January 20, 20001.

4.3.2. Zone 2 Coot Season.

4.3.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October 12, 19992000 and closes on October 164, 19992000.

4.3.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on November 173, 19992000 and closes January 86, 20001.

4.4. Gallinule Seasons.

4.4.1. Zone 1 Gallinule Season.

4.4.1.a. The first segment of this season opens on October 12, 19992000 and closes on October 164, 19992000.

4.4.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November 297, 19992000 and closes on January 20, 20001.

4.4.2. Zone 2 Gallinule Season.

4.4.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October 12, 19992000 and closes on October 164, 19992000.

4.4.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on November 173, 19992000 and closes January 86, 20001.

4.5. Canada Goose Seasons.

4.5.1. Zone 1 Canada Goose Season.

4.5.1.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~4, ~~1999~~2000.

4.5.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November ~~27~~5, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 31, ~~2000~~1.

4.5.2. Zone 2 Canada Goose Season.

4.5.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~30~~28, ~~1999~~2000.

4.5.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on December ~~11~~9, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 31, ~~2000~~1.

4.6. Snow Goose and Blue Goose Seasons.

4.6.1. Zone 1 Snow Goose and Blue Goose Seasons.

4.6.1.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~16~~4, ~~1999~~2000.

4.6.1.b. The second segment of this season opens on November ~~27~~5, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 31, ~~2000~~1.

4.6.2. Zone 2 Snow Goose and Blue Goose Season.

4.6.2.a. The first segment of this season opens on October ~~12~~, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on October ~~30~~28, ~~1999~~2000.

4.6.2.b. The second segment of this season opens on December ~~11~~9, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 31, ~~2000~~1.

4.7. Brant Season.

4.7.1. This season opens on November 27, ~~1999~~2000 and closes on January 20, ~~2000~~1.

4.8. Swan Season.

4.8.1. There is no open season for swans.

§58-57-5. Shooting and Falconry Hours.

- 5.1. Ducks.
 - 5.1.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.2. Mergansers.
 - 5.2.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.3. Coots.
 - 5.3.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.4. Gallinules.
 - 5.4.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.5. Canada Geese.
 - 5.5.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.6. Snow Geese and Blue Geese.
 - 5.6.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- 5.7. Brant.
 - 5.7.1. Shooting and falconry hours are from thirty (30) minutes before sunrise until sunset.

§58-57-6. Shooting Bag and Possession Limits.

- 6.1. Ducks.
 - 6.1.1. The bag limit is six (6) ducks in aggregate per day and may include:

- hens;
- 6.1.1.a. Only one (1) black duck;
 - 6.1.1.b. No more than four (4) old squaw;
 - 6.1.1.c. No more than four (4) mallards only two (2) of which may be
 - 6.1.1.d. No more than three (3) scaup;
 - 6.1.1.e. Only one (1) pintail;
 - 6.1.1.f. No more than two (2) redheads;
 - 6.1.1.g. No more than two (2) wood ducks; and
 - 6.1.1.h. Only one (1) canvasback.

6.1.2. The possession limit is twelve (12) ducks in aggregate and may include:

- be hen mallards;
- 6.1.2.a. No more than two (2) black ducks;
 - 6.1.2.b. No more than eight (8) old squaw;
 - 6.1.2.c. No more than eight (8) mallards only four (4) of which may
 - 6.1.2.d. No more than six (6) scaup;
 - 6.1.2.e. No more than two (2) pintails;
 - 6.1.2.f. No more than four (4) redheads;
 - 6.1.2.g. No more than four (4) wood ducks; and
 - 6.1.2.h. No more than two (2) canvasbacks.

6.2. Mergansers.

6.2.1. The bag limit is five (5) mergansers in aggregate per day and may include only one (1) hooded merganser.

6.2.2. The possession limit is ten (10) mergansers in aggregate and may include no more than two (2) hooded mergansers.

6.3. Coots.

6.3.1. The bag limit is fifteen (15) coots per day.

6.3.2. The possession limit is thirty (30) coots.

6.4. Gallinules.

6.4.1. The bag limit is fifteen (15) gallinules per day.

6.4.2. The possession limit is thirty (30) gallinules.

6.5. Canada Goose.

6.5.1. The bag limit is three (3) Canada geese per day.

6.5.2. The possession limit is six (6) Canada geese.

6.6. Snow Geese and Blue Geese.

6.6.1. The bag limit is five (5) snow and blue geese in aggregate per day.

6.6.2. The possession limit is ten (10) snow and blue geese in aggregate.

6.7. Brant.

6.7.1. The bag limit is two (2) brant per day.

6.7.2. The possession limit is four (4) brant.

§58-57-7. Falconry Bag and Possession Limits.

7.1. The bag limit for falconry hunting is three (3) migratory game birds in the aggregate per day.

7.2. The possession limit for falconry hunting is six (6) migratory game birds in the aggregate.

§58-57-8. Youth Waterfowl Hunting Season.

8.1. The youth waterfowl hunting season for taking ducks, geese, coots, mergansers and gallinules is open September ~~1830~~, ~~1999~~2000 only.

8.2. The bag and possession limit for the youth waterfowl season is the same as the regular season daily bag limits listed in §58-57-6.
