Dear Mr. Kapouralas:

Enclosed are the copies of your rules, forms and other general information that you need if you plan to file rules in our office.

As I was copying the rules that are proposed, I realized that both of these rules are series 1. However, the rule filed in October has more changes in it -- including adopting the "Orange Book" by reference, while the series 1 that was filed in March, 1989, deals mainly with the automated data processing system (all of these changes are also included in the first rule filed).

You should withdraw at least one of these rules. In order to do that, we need a letter from you stating that you wish to withdraw a rule, specify exactly which one you want to withdraw.

If you have substantial changes that you wish to make to either of these, it may be better to start from scratch. That would mean withdrawing both of the rules and starting fresh with another public hearing.

However, if you wish to use either of these rules, you need to file an agency approved rule with our office. You need to include a summary of the hearing and/or written comments that you received and why you are/are not changing the rule because of the comments. We need one copy. After you have one copy stamped in our office, you need to take 15 stamped copies to the Legislative Rule Making Review Committee.
