

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
WEST VIRGINIA BOARD OF EDUCATION**

POLICY NUMBER AND TITLE: West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission Series 2, Athletics, Provisions Governing Eligibility and Series 3, Provisions Governing Contests Proposed Changes in Rules and Regulations

BACKGROUND

The majority of public and most private schools in West Virginia belong to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission. Each year, the principals of member schools submit revisions to the rules and regulations. The submitted proposals are presented and voted upon at the annual Board of Control meeting. Any approved changes are then submitted to the West Virginia State Board of Education for its review and approval.

PURPOSE

These amendments are brought forth to keep the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission current and updated on changes, trends and issues in the band and athletic programs.

These proposals were distributed for public comment in May and June. The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission will present to the Board the comments received for its review at the June meeting.

The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission staff, Constitution and Bylaws Committee, and Board of Control respectfully request that the proposed rule changes to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission Rules and Regulations Handbook be approved.

CONTENT

Twelve proposals are being submitted to the State Board by the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission. Each rule change is presented with the whole rule being included. This will help the State Board members understand the significance of the rule change.

The following is a brief summary of the effect of each proposal:

1. Present rule would exclude WV Schools for Deaf and Blind. (Vote: Yes-145 No-2)
2. To allow vocational administrators to attend events with courtesy cards. (Vote: Yes-114 No-33)
3. To insure administrators gain admittance to events with courtesy cards. (Vote: Yes-147 No-0)
4. To allow for more flexibility in scheduling during the summer and allow coaches of sports other than football and basketball to attend summer camps at colleges and universities. (Vote: Yes-97 No-54)

5. To allow for more flexibility in scheduling during the summer and allow coaches of sports other than football and basketball to attend summer camps at colleges and universities. (Vote: Yes-118 No-33)
6. To allow schools in the smallest classification to compete for state champions in basketball and football against teams with whom they are on equal footing. (Vote: Yes-96 No-55)
7. To lessen size differential within each class.
8. To promote safety of student athletes by limiting their participation in all high school sports. (Vote: Yes-133 No-2)
9. Emergency rule passed for 2005-06. (Vote: Yes-140 No-0)
10. To allow high schools flexibility in scheduling 1st contest. (Vote: Yes-139 No-2)
11. To promote safety of student athletes by limiting their participation in all high school sports. (Vote: Yes-135 No-0)
12. To allow more time for mandatory practices without practicing all holiday break. (Vote: Yes-125 No-7)

2006-07 Proposed Rule Changes and Public Comment Summary

Proposal 1 (Passed 145-2)

Amend 127-2-3 Enrollment and Team Membership (pg. 16) as follows:

- 3.10. Boarding students at member schools, with the exception of students at the WV Schools for the Deaf and Blind, are not eligible. (Definition: A boarding student is one who receives room and board that is provided by said school unless such residence is based on Court Order or State Action.)

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (0) Against

Proposal 2 (Passed 114-33)

Amend 127-3-2 Duties and Responsibilities of the Principal (pg. 35) as follows:

- 2.10. The principal, assistant principal, vocational administrator and athletic director of each member school shall be allowed admittance to any WVSSAC sanctioned event. This admittance will be by presentation of the WVSSAC Courtesy Card and a photo identification.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (0) Against

Proposal 3 (Passed 147-0)

Amend 127-3-2 Duties and Responsibilities of the Principal (pg. 35) as follows:

- 2.12 WVSSAC Courtesy and Identification Cards ~~should~~ shall be honored at all events involving WVSSAC member schools with the exception of state tournaments.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (0) Against

Proposal 4 (Passed 97-54)

Amend 127-3-7 Out of Season Coaching (pg. 37) as follows:

- 7.2. School organized out-of-season practice or related activities shall only be permitted with principal approval ~~during Weeks 50, 51, and 52 of the National Federation Standardized Calendar~~ from the day after the completion of the State Baseball Tournament until the first day of fall football practice. All schools will observe a two (2) week dead period during the week preceding the Fourth of July and the week of the Fourth of July. During this two-week period, there can be no coaching or any contact or observation by any coach, faculty or non-faculty, with any student-athletes. This dead period shall also apply to weight programs. Participation by students must be open to all students, voluntary, and not required directly or indirectly for membership on a school team. Participation by students during these weeks does not meet Practice Rule 127-2-13.4.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (5) For (9) Against

1. Coaches will demand too much time from the students.
2. It will help our students be more competitive with athletes from other states.

Proposal 5 (Passed 118-33)

Amend 127-3-7 Out of Season Coaching (pg. 37) as follows: (Not to be voted upon if #8 fails)

- 7.3. A coach or principal designee of each sport or activity may be present as an observer, lecture participant, staff member, or in any capacity at any summer camp ~~during Weeks 50, 51, and 52 of the~~

National Federation Standardized Calendar from the day after the completion of the State Baseball Tournament until the first day of fall football practice except during the two (2) week dead period mentioned in Rule 127-3-7.2.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (5) For (9) Against

Proposal 6 (Passed 96-55)

Amend 127-3-10 Classification (pg. 40) as follows:

- 10.1. Each member public high school shall be classified as either AAA, AA, or A based on the enrollment figures in grades 9-10-11 at the end of the second school month of the odd numbered year preceding the classification and all private schools shall be classified as AP.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (49) For (76) Against

1. This rule change discriminates against private schools.
2. Private schools have an unfair advantage over public schools, especially in Class "A".

Proposal 7 (Passed 84-69)

Amend 127-3-10 Classification (pg. 40) as follows:

- 10.1. Each member high school with the exception of football shall be classified as either AAA, AA, or A based on the enrollment figures in grades 9-10-11 at the end of the second school month of the odd numbered year preceding the classification. Football only, will be classified as either AAAA, AAA, AA, or A.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (4) For (1) Against

1. This rule would reduce the difference in school size for all classes.
2. West Virginia is not large enough for four (4) classes.

NOTE: If proposals 6 and 7 are both approved, they will be combined into one rule, 10.1 to read as follows:

Each member public high school with the exception of football shall be classified as either AAA, AA, or A based on the enrollment figures in grades 9-10-11 at the end of the second school month of the odd numbered year preceding the classification, and all private schools shall be classified as AP. Football only, will be classified as either AAAA, AAA, AA or A.

Proposal 8 (Passed 133-2)

Amend 127-3-19 Baseball (pg. 45) by adding the following:

19.7 Student Participation:

19.7.1 A student may not play or practice on a non-school baseball team while a member of his school team.

19.7.2 A student shall not participate in more than 32 games in one season, exclusive of sectional, regional and state tournament contests. Serving as a "courtesy or pinch runner" is not considered "participation" in a game.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (2) For (0) Against

Proposal 9 (Passed 140-0)

Amend 127-3-21 Cheerleading (pg 46) as follows:

21.3. Length of Season: The high school cheerleading spirit and competitive season will begin Monday of Week 5. The competitive season will end for each team at their cheer tournament elimination. The high school spirit season will end on the last day of the Girls' State Basketball Tournament or Boys' State Basketball Tournament.

21.6.2. The junior high/middle school cheerleading spirit and competitive cheer season will begin Monday of Week 6. The competitive season will end Saturday of Week 18. The junior high/middle school spirit season will end on the last day of the junior high/middle school girls' or boys' basketball season.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (0) Against

Proposal 10 (Passed 139-2)

Amend 127-3-23 Football (pg. 47) as follows:

23.2. Organized Team Practice: Organized team conditioning practice will begin on Monday of Week 5 and the first contest may be played ~~on the Friday of~~ during Week 8.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (0) Against

Proposal 11 (Passed 135-0)

Amend 127-3-26 Softball (pg. 52) by adding the following:

26.7 Student Participation:

26.7.1 A student may not play or practice on a non-school softball team while a member of the school team.

26.7.2 A student shall not participate in more than 32 games in one season, exclusive of sectional, regional and state tournament contests. Serving as a "courtesy or pinch runner" is not considered "participation" in a game.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (1) For (1) Against

Proposal 12 (Passed 125-7)

Amend 127-3-31 Wrestling (pg. 55) as follows:

31.8.1. Organized Team Practice: Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 19 and the first contest may be played on Wednesday of Week 22.

31.8.1 2. Junior high school teams may have 14 matches including tournaments sanctioned by the WVSSAC.

31.8.2 3. Junior high teams are permitted one (1) scrimmage under the same conditions as a high school.

31.8.3 4. Junior high season will be completed by Saturday of Week 33.

§127-2-1. General.

1.1. Scope. - These rules establish the provisions governing student eligibility to participate in interscholastic athletics.

1.2. Authority. - W.Va. Constitution, Article XII, §2 and W.Va. Code §18-2-25.

1.3. Filing Date. - July 13, 2006.

1.4. Effective Date. - September 11, 2006.

§127-2-2. Waivers.

2.1. The Board of Directors is authorized to grant a waiver to a rule when it determines the rule fails to accomplish the purpose for which it is intended or when the rule works extreme and undue hardship upon the student.

2.2. Speculative loss of college scholarship is not considered a basis for granting a waiver to these rules.

§127-2-3. Enrollment and Team Membership.

3.1. To be eligible for participation in interscholastic athletics, a student must be enrolled full-time in a member school as described in Rule 127-2-6 on or before the eleventh instructional day of the school year. Enrollment must be continuous after the student has officially enrolled in the school.

3.2. Students can participate only in schools in which they are enrolled; however, an exception may be granted by the Board of Directors as follows:

3.2.1. if a feeder school does not afford students the opportunity to participate and they are otherwise eligible.

3.2.2. for students from the WV Schools for the Deaf and the Blind (WVSD&B) to participate at Hampshire High School or Romney Middle School (only in sports not available at WVSD&B).

3.2.3. if member schools containing grades 6 and/or 7 and/or 8 and/or 9 may combine students from two or more schools within the county to form one interscholastic team in a sport. Requests for permission to combine students from two or more schools in the same non-public or public school system must be submitted annually to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission (WVSSAC) in writing by the superintendent of the non-public or public school system. Schools which are combining to form one team must be feeder schools for the same high school and at least one school does not have sufficient numbers for a team. If more than two schools are involved, principals are to evaluate the number of available participants in each school and shall combine schools to provide as many teams that sufficient numbers will allow. Sufficient numbers will be defined as the number of a starting line-up plus 50% (for odd number line-ups, round up).

3.2.4. Students enrolled in the ninth grade of a four, five or six year high school may participate on the high school team. Also, ninth graders of a feeder school may participate on their high school team and sixth grade students of a K-6 elementary feeder school may participate on their junior high team if granted permission by the county board of education or governing body of a private/parochial school and the school principals involved. Once a ninth grade student becomes a member of the high school team said student will be ineligible for the junior high team in that sport.

3.2.5. Students at a junior high or middle feeder school who are not provided the opportunity to participate because of age may move up to their high school if granted permission by the county board of education or governing body of a private/parochial school and the school principals involved.

3.3. A student academically ineligible by rule may begin practicing 15 school days immediately prior to the dates of regaining full eligibility provided all other eligibility requirements are met.

3.4. Students enrolled in the following grades in member schools will be eligible for junior high participation:

<i>Junior High Schools</i>	<i>High Schools</i>	<i>Middle Schools</i>
Grades 7 and 8	7, 8 and 9 (six year school)	6, 7, 8 (3-year or 4-year school)
Grades 7, 8, and 9	8 and 9 (five year school)	
Grades 8 and 9	9 (four year school)	

3.5. Sixth grade students may be eligible to participate in interscholastic sport teams except football in the middle school in which they are enrolled.

3.6. Students who are enrolled in a grade below the ninth are not eligible for a high school team, and students enrolled in a grade below the seventh will not be eligible for a junior high team. Students enrolled in a grade below the sixth will not be eligible for a middle school team.

3.7. Senior students will be eligible for spring sports until the close of the school's season.

3.8. Schools may sponsor separate teams for members of each sex where selection for such teams is based upon competitive skill. If a school sponsors a team in a particular sport for members of one sex but sponsors no such team for members of the other sex, and athletic opportunities for members of that sex previously have been limited, members of the excluded sex must be allowed to try out for the team offered. For example, because overall athletic opportunities for females have previously been limited, females will be allowed to try out for baseball, but males will not be allowed to try out for volleyball or softball.

3.9. Students enrolled at WV School for the Deaf will be allowed to participate in sports at the WV School for the Blind. Students from the WV School for the Blind will be allowed to participate in sports at the WV School for the Deaf.

3.10. Boarding students at member schools, with the exception of students at the WV Schools for the Deaf and Blind, are not eligible. (Definition: A boarding student is one who receives room and board that is provided by said school unless such residence is based on Court Order or State Action.)

§127-2-4. Age.

4.1. A student in high school who becomes 19 and a student in junior high school who becomes 16 before August 1 shall be ineligible for interscholastic competition.

127CSR2

4.2. A student in high school who becomes 19 and a student in junior high school who becomes 16 on or after August 1 shall remain eligible for the entire year.

4.3. A student in a middle school (eighth grade being the highest grade) who becomes 15 before August 1 shall be ineligible for interscholastic competition at that level.

4.4. A student in a middle school (eighth grade being the highest grade) who becomes 15 on or after August 1 shall remain eligible for the entire school year at that level.

§127-2-5. Semester and Season.

5.1. A student may have the privilege to participate in the interscholastic program for four consecutive years (eight consecutive semesters or equivalent) after entering the ninth grade of a four-year high school or the ninth grade in a 7-9 junior high school.

5.2. A student shall not participate for more than two seasons while in grades 7-8 of a junior high/high school or no more than three seasons while in grades 6-7-8 of a middle school in any interscholastic activity.

5.3. Students retained without failing.

5.3.1. *Loss of eligibility.* A student held back in the sixth, seventh or eighth grade without failing shall lose one of the four years of high school eligibility for each year the student is held back.

5.3.2. *Loss of fourth year.* A student held back one year in the seventh or eighth grade without failing shall lose the fourth year of eligibility after entering the ninth grade.

5.3.3. *Loss of third and fourth years.* A student held back for two years in the seventh or eighth grade without failing shall lose both the third and fourth years of eligibility after entering the ninth grade.

5.4. Ten days of attendance or enrollment shall constitute a semester. Said ten days includes the day of enrollment, the last day of attendance and the elapsed time between, provided that they are days when school was actually in session.

5.5. The number of semesters of athletic eligibility of a student is determined by semesters of enrollment and attendance and not by semesters of participation. (This applies for students in grades 9-12 only).

5.6. A student whose eligibility expires with the end of a semester shall not become ineligible until report cards are issued or five school days into the next semester, whichever is less. The student will be considered eligible any days between the two semesters.

5.7. Any part of a contest or interscholastic event in which a student competes shall be counted as a season for that sport in grades 6-12 and a semester of participation in grades 9-12.

5.8. The Board of Directors is authorized to grant a waiver to the Semester and Season Rule when it feels the rule fails to accomplish the purpose for which it is intended and when the rule works extreme and undue hardship upon the student. Waivers may be granted in the following circumstances:

5.8.1. The Board is authorized to consider cases in which a student entering high school (explained in Rule 5.1) did not stay in continuous enrollment because of personal illness, or no school was available, or because of other undue hardship reasons ascertained through investigation.

127CSR2

5.8.2. The Board may provide release from the continuous enrollment restriction provided no participation had occurred during the semester(s) in question.

5.8.3. In no event may a student be allowed to participate in more than four (4) seasons in any one sport in grades 9-12.

5.9. The Board may also assess appropriate penalties to the student or to the school if said Board determines through its investigation that said student or said school did try to evade the rule by subterfuge.

§127-2-6. Scholarship.

6.1. A student is required to do passing work in the equivalent of at least 20 periods (four subjects with full credit toward graduation) per week. Failure to earn passing marks in four full credit subjects during a semester shall render a student ineligible for the following semester.

6.1.1. A semester course that constitutes 8100 minutes of instruction (block schedule) will count as two subjects.

6.1.2. The student may select four full credits from any area of the curriculum offered by the school.

6.1.3. If a student is taking a multiple period subject, such as block or vocational courses for a full morning or afternoon, it may be counted as more than one subject. The number of subjects counted will be equal to the units of full credits given.

6.1.4. If a student has been declared ineligible according to the standards outlined above, the student may attend summer school and have eligibility reinstated if the student meets the standards at the conclusion of summer school.

6.1.5. If a student has been declared ineligible according to the standards outlined above, the student may have eligibility reinstated at midsemester if the student is meeting the standards at that time.

6.2. *Note:* Full credit is defined as one-half credit for a semester or 4050 minutes as provided by West Virginia Board of Education §126-42-1 et seq., "Assuring the Quality of Education: Regulations for Education Programs" (Policy 2510).

6.3. Schools providing for planned programs of independent learning during the regular school term may wish not to require all students to attend classes for 4050 minutes during a semester. In such instances, full credit may be awarded for satisfactory performance provided that it meets standards established by the county and West Virginia Department of Education.

6.4. Full credit may be awarded for subjects in addition to those offered by the school as well as experimental programs developed by the school itself provided that it meets standards established by the county and West Virginia Department of Education.

6.5. A student not attempting four (4) full credit subjects during a semester must complete one semester of school work to regain eligibility.

6.6. Any student who withdraws from school and does not re-enroll within 10 school days of that withdrawal date will lose eligibility for the remainder of that semester.

127CSR2

6.7. Credit deficiencies cannot be made up after the last day of the semester, except in a case where a student whose final examinations and course credit are delayed due to illness which can be verified by a physician.

6.8. The official school transcript will be used to determine a student's eligibility and will be regarded as final.

6.9. In accordance with West Virginia Board of Education §126-26-1 et seq., "Participation in Extracurricular Activities" (Policy 2436.10, C-Rule), students must maintain a 2.0 average to participate in interscholastic athletics. (See Appendix.)

§127-2-7. Residence-Transfer.

7.1. Part A - Residence - This residence rule applies to all students enrolled in grades 6-12 in both public and non-public member schools.

7.1.1. A student shall be eligible in the zone in which the student's parents reside. Public secondary school attendance zones shall be established by official action by each county Board of Education. Zones of nonpublic member schools shall be established by their governing board and subject to approval by Board of Directors. Said non-public member schools attendance zones shall not exceed the boundaries of the county in which they are located.

7.1.2. A student shall be eligible when enrolling to attend a member secondary school for the first time in the zone in which the parents reside, unless the student has established eligibility under Rule 127-2-7.2.3 in another attendance zone.

7.1.3. When a town or city is located in two counties and only one public secondary school is located in the town or city, students living in the town or city may attend this secondary school if mutually agreed upon by the two county boards of education and approved by the Board of Directors.

7.1.4. A student who is in the care of the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources shall be eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics as a member of the athletic teams of the secondary school in the zone in which said West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources places the student in a home, provided the student is otherwise eligible.

7.1.5. A student may be eligible outside the specified zone of attendance if the student has been in attendance in that zone the immediate preceding year (365 days) prior to entering a member secondary school. There can be no change of residence involving change of attendance zone during the immediate preceding year (365 days).

a. Should the parents make a bona fide change of residence to a new school zone during the school term, a student may remain in the school zone from which the parents moved and retain eligibility.

b. A student whose parents have resided in the school zone for a minimum of one academic year at which the student has been in attendance for a minimum of one academic year and whose parents move out of the school zone may:

A. Retain eligibility as long as said student retains continuous enrollment and attendance or:

B. Transfer at time of change of residence to the school in the attendance zone in which the parents are now residing and be eligible in that school or:

C. Transfer at any time prior to the start of the next school year to the school in the attendance zone in which his parents are residing and be eligible for interscholastic activities at the receiving school.

127CSR2

7.1.6. Foreign exchange students, attending a member school under the auspices of a Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET) student exchange program, shall be considered eligible regarding residence for a maximum period of one calendar year. Said foreign exchange student may not be a graduate of the secondary school of the home country and must maintain eligibility in a member school. A foreign exchange program must assign students to schools by a method which insures that no student, school, or other interested party may influence the assignment for athletic purposes.

7.1.7. A student returning from an approved foreign exchange program may resume interscholastic competition in a member school at the point of interruption provided the student does not fulfill graduation requirements while participating in the exchange program and provided the student meets all requirements relative to age and semesters of eligibility.

7.2. Part B - Transfer.

7.2.1. A student becomes immediately eligible, providing all other eligibility requirements are met, when parents make a bona fide change of residence to a new school zone. Determination of a bona fide change of residence depends upon the facts of each case.

7.2.2. If a student transfers during the school year from a secondary school in one zone to a secondary school in another zone, said student shall be ineligible for 365 days from date of enrollment unless the parents become residents of the zone to which the student transfers. Students transferring out of attendance zone shall immediately forfeit eligibility in the attendance zone unless exempted by Rule 127-2-7.2.8 and 127-2-7.2.9.

7.2.3. Students who transfer during the school year to or from a member or non-member school shall be ineligible for 365 days from date of enrollment unless the parents move from one member school zone to another member school zone in conjunction with transfer of schools.

7.2.4. If the transfer is from a non-member school to a member school in the zone where the student's parents reside, a student is eligible providing; (1) the student is enrolling in a member school for the first time and (2) the principals of both non-member and member schools involved concur that undue influence is not involved with the transfer.

7.2.5. A student may be transferred from one attendance zone to another zone within the same county by a county board of education and maintain eligibility. The transfer must be initiated by county board of education personnel to fulfill certain special education programs(s) not available in the attendance zone from which the student is transferred. Upon the completion of the special program, the student must return to the attendance zone of the student's residence.

7.2.6. For the purpose of athletic eligibility, the Commission does not recognize emancipated status as relates to transfer except as might occur in marriage and relocation to another school zone.

7.2.7. Notwithstanding any other provisions of WVSSAC rules and regulations, if a student transfers for athletic reasons, the student will be ineligible for 365 days from the date of enrollment.

7.2.8. If a student is released and accepted by formal actions of county boards of education or similar governing bodies of a non-public school which have verified that such transfer is not for athletic purposes, said student will be granted immediate eligibility provided all other rules are met. The transfer must occur at the beginning of the 9th grade school year with the student enrolled on or before the eleventh instructional day of the beginning of the school year and provided that said student is residing with the parents. Once a student has been a member of a team that has participated in a scrimmage or contest, the student has established eligibility at that school.

127CSR2

7.2.9. During the 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th grades, a student shall be entitled to one transfer back into the public member school located within the attendance zone where the student's parents residence is located regardless of from where the student is transferring. A student shall be entitled to transfer back to a non-public member school if said student had been enrolled in said non-public member school or non-public member feeder school the 365 days prior to enrollment in the 9th grade. Any student transferring under the provisions of this rule will not become eligible until the completion of the school year in which said transfer occurs. Eligibility will begin with the succeeding fall sports season. Transfer must be completed prior to the first day of school.

7.2.10. The eligibility of a student whose parents are divorced or legally separated is determined by the following:

- a. court decree establishing residency with one parent.

7.2.11. After establishing initial residency with one parent, all subsequent transfers will require a period of ineligibility for 365 days from date of enrollment unless a change of residency is decreed by the court.

§127-2-8. Adoption/Guardianship.

8.1. A student shall be eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics only if (1) residing with one or both of the parents; (2) residing with a testamentary guardian following the death of the parents; or (3) residing in a location where the student was placed by the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources pursuant to WVSSAC Rule 127-2-7.1.5.

8.2. The residence of a testamentary guardian shall constitute the residence of the ward when, and only when, (1) such testamentary guardian has been duly appointed by the last will and testament of the student's last surviving parent; (2) said testamentary guardian has duly qualified as such before the proper tribunal in West Virginia; and (3) the student is actually residing in the household of the testamentary guardian at the time of the student's sport participation.

8.3. Notwithstanding any other provision of the WVSSAC rules and regulations, any student residing with a guardian/custodian other than a testamentary guardian may not compete for a school in any sport on the varsity level but may compete at the junior varsity level.

8.4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of WVSSAC rules and regulations, legal guardian/custodian may not be changed for athletic reasons. A transfer for athletic reasons is defined as, but not limited to:

8.4.1. Seeking a superior athletic team;

8.4.2. Seeking a team consistent with the student's ability;

8.4.3. Seeking relief from conflict with the philosophy or action of an administrator, teacher or coach relating to athletics;

8.4.4. Seeking a means to nullify punitive action by the previous school.

§127-2-9. Undue Influence - Recruiting.

9.1. The use of influence by a person or group connected or not connected with the school to secure or retain a student for athletic participation is not permitted and may cause the student to be ineligible and may cause certain sanctions to be placed against the member school.

127CSR2

9.2. An employee of the school system shall not initiate any communication regarding athletic participation or enrollment with a student, parent of a student, guardian or family member, in person or through a third party prior to enrollment. This does not include the introduction of athletic programs to students at feeder schools during a school's scheduling process.

9.3. A student, parent of a student, or guardian shall not be offered for the purpose of encouraging enrollment in a school or participation in an athletic program any inducement, such as free tuition, jobs, supplies, uniforms, other than that which is provided for all students.

§127-2-10. Non-school Participation.

10.1. During the school year and while a member of a school team, a student shall neither participate on any formally organized non-school team in the same sport, nor shall the student compete as an individual unattached in non-school formally organized competition in the same sport. The following sports are exempted from the provisions of this rule: cross country, golf, swimming, tennis, track, and wrestling, providing:

10.1.1. participation is approved by the student's principal.

10.1.2. the student misses no school-sponsored athletic contest involving a team in that sport.

10.2. A student may participate as a member of a national team (and the actual, direct tryouts thereof) which is defined as:

10.2.1. one selected by the national governing body of the sport,

10.2.2. while representing the National Federation in an International Schoolsport Federation, or

10.2.3. as a representative of the United States in recognized national or international events.

10.2.4. a qualifier for the West Virginia Golf Association's Amateur Championship or the United States Golf Association's United States Amateur Championship.

10.3. A student who has participated on a non-school team or as an individual unattached in non-school formally organized competition after the beginning practice date of that sport will be ineligible for participation on that school team for that season in that particular sport except as provided by Rules §127-2-10.1 and 10.2.

§127-2-11. Amateur.

11.1. A student who represents a school in an interscholastic sport shall be an amateur in that sport. An amateur athlete is one who engages in athletic competition solely for the physical, mental, social, and pleasure benefits derived therefrom. An athlete forfeits amateur status in a sport by:

11.1.1. competing for money or other monetary compensation (allowable travel, meals and lodging expenses may be accepted);

11.1.2. receiving any award or prize of monetary value which has not been approved by the WVSSAC;

11.1.3. capitalizing on athletic fame by receiving money or gifts of monetary value (scholarships to institutions of higher learning are specifically exempted);

127CSR2

11.1.4. signing a professional playing contract in that sport.

11.2. Accepting a nominal, standard fee or salary for instructing, supervising or officiating in organized youth sports program or recreation, playground or camp activities shall not jeopardize amateur status. "Organized youth sports program" includes both school and non-school programs. Compensation for giving private lessons is permissible if approved by the WVSSAC.

11.3. A student who loses amateur status may apply to the WVSSAC for reinstatement in the interscholastic program after a waiting period of one complete high school season (starting practice date through state tournament or end of season) for that sport.

11.4. A senior student may participate in a professional tryout either during or after the season of that sport provided

11.4.1. that it does not occur on the day of a school contest of that sport, or

11.4.2. that it meets with the principal's approval.

§127-2-12. Participation as an Ineligible.

12.1. Any student who participates in an interscholastic athletic contest as an ineligible, either knowingly or inadvertently, shall be ineligible for a period not to exceed 365 days as determined by the Executive Director.

§127-2-13. Practice.

13.1. Only students enrolled in the specific member school are allowed to participate in that school's practices. Exceptions - Rules 127-2-3.2 and 127-2-3.5.

13.2. The frequency and length of practice is at the discretion of each member school.

13.3. Member schools of the WVSSAC may practice on any day of the year with the exception of Sunday practice. Rule 127-3-14.2 further clarifies Sunday practice.

13.4. Individual players of a team must have practiced

13.4.1. on 7 SEPARATE days before participating in an interscholastic scrimmage.

13.4.2. on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest. The following sport(s) is exempted from the provisions of this rule: golf.

13.5. A student shall not be permitted to engage in interscholastic practice until that student has filed with the principal a completed Athletic Participation/Parental Consent/Physician's Certificate Form. Rule 127-3-3 further explains this required form.

13.6. A student academically ineligible may begin practicing 15 school days immediately prior to the date of regaining full eligibility.

13.7. If a student has established eligibility in a sport requiring 14 separate days of practice and is continuing to participate in that sport or no school days have lapsed from one sport to another sport in a same season, the student

127CSR2

may participate in another sport of the season after completing seven separate days of sport specific practice in the second sport.

13.8. Students participating in a sport(s) in one season must have practiced 14 separate days, exclusive of the day of a contest, to be eligible to participate in a sport in the next season with the following exception: the student has continued to practice or participate in tournament play without an interruption of school days. The student must complete seven separate days of sport specific practice in the second sport.

127CSR2

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ALL-STAR GAME - a contest where all contestants on each team are students selected from four or more school teams. No more than three students from any one school may participate on the same team.

COACH - county board/governing body contracted or approved facilitator of any secondary school athletic team.

COMMISSION - the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission.

CONTEST or GAME - one or more of the following conditions are present: previous agreement, advertisement, score and/or time kept, spectators present, regulation or modified rules used, coverage appearing in local media, sufficient number of students to form teams, admission charged, and/or contest officiated by registered officials.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES - nonacademic activities such as interscholastic athletics, student government, class officers, marching band that is not a part of the curricular band, and clubs which are not closely related to identifiable programs/areas of study.

FACULTY MEMBER - one who has a full-time teacher permit as defined by the West Virginia Board of Education Policy 5202.

FEEDER SCHOOL - the middle or junior high school designated by the county board of education/governing body as the school of attendance prior to entrance into the high school.

FULL CREDIT COURSE - one-half credit for a semester or 4050 minutes as taken from the West Virginia Board of Education, "Graduation Requirements for West Virginia Public Schools: Adolescent Education (Grades 9-12) (Policy 2510-2005)".

FULL TIME STUDENT - a student doing passing work in the equivalent of at least 20 periods per week. (Traditional Schedule - four subjects will full credit toward graduation; Block Schedule - two subjects with full credit toward graduation.)

GRID-O-RAMA - See Preview and Scrimmage definitions.

MEMBER SCHOOL - a school that is a member of the WVSSAC.

PREVIEW - must be three or more teams; teams are only allowed to play the equivalent of one contest; all conditions of a scrimmage.

PRINCIPAL - the individual charged with supervision, management, and control of a secondary school.

SCRIMMAGE - after seven days of practice; prior to the first contest; without keeping score in a book or on a score board; not under game conditions (examples include basketball and soccer - quarters; three outs-baseball and softball); admission may be charged; free substitution; time-outs permitted; if officials are used, they must be WV registered officials.

SEMESTER - a block of instructional time that is equivalent to at least one-half of the school year. (See Policy 2510.)

SECONDARY SCHOOL - a high school, junior high school or middle school as registered with the West Virginia Department of Education.

127CSR2

SOCCER-O-RAMA - See Preview and Scrimmage definitions.

STUDENT - a male or female participant in interscholastic athletics or band activities.

SUBSTITUTE TEACHER - a person who has met the licensure requirements as specified by the West Virginia State Board of Education and has been approved as a substitute teacher of that county board of education, private, or parochial school.

VARSITY - primary representative team of a high school.



I oppose the proposal to segregate the private schools into a separate class for extracurricular activities.

I am a graduate of WV public schools and participated in varsity sports during my high school years. I have lived both here in WV and in other states.

To create a new, additional classification for schools in a state as small as WV is inappropriate and misguided. I will not pass judgement on the motives of the supporters but the focus is completely off base. Schools have continually consolidated over the past 20+ years... taking smaller, rural schools and creating larger county schools. This reduction in the number of schools means that the current population within the three class system continue to shrink. Adding an additional class would just magnify the situation.

A primary purpose of extracurricular activities...especially athletics, is to allow the student athlete the opportunity to build self esteem, skills, become part of a team, and yes, face adversity. No entitlement exists and should not. Throughout life, one faces larger companies, greater competition, better talent, etc. Athletics is a critical component in the maturation process.

Creating a separate class would be negative for both the schools placed in that class (e.g., a very small group with little meaning for competition or development) and to the other schools that would not have to compete with a like-sized school to better develop and experience true competition.

I never won a "championship" in high school. But I won in many other ways through the competition - building self confidence, dealing with loss, etc. Please do not take that opportunity away from from our small public school students.

If the theory is correct that these Class A "rural" schools should not have to compete against "urban" schools, neither should Lewis County, Buckhannon Upshur, and Nicholas County High have to compete against the likes of Parkersburg High, Parkersburg South, Martinsburg, Wheeling Park, Huntington and any of the Class AAA schools in the Kanawha-Putnam Counties area. The same can be said for Webster County High, Summers County High (although their girl's high school team made it to ! the finals this past season) or Clay County (also a state tournament participant) have to compete against Winfield, Bluefield or Weir High Schools.

Simply because a "group" of schools who are legitimate and legal members of the WVSSAC have managed to win a series of different state tournament titles, it does not mean that these schools should be segregated. Fairmont Senior, ONE school, has managed to dominate the boy's swim titles. Parkersburg South and Parkersburg High

have dominated wrestling at the AAA level as well. Berkley Springs and Doddridge County Highs have made many appearances in both track and cross country finals. And those are single schools, not a "group" of schools. It is wrong to send a message to "rural" schools who have complained that the answer is to segregate other schools who have managed to work hard and earn the honor of becoming teams who reach the penacle of their sport. If the only reason schools compete in sports is to play in the "finals" of a sport, simply make the trophy for each sport a "traveling" trophy, awarding it to every school on a specific timeline and do away with all state!

championships. That would make as much sense as segregating WVSSAC member private schools simply because in this cycle of sports, they have done well.

Dear West Virginia Board of Education and Mr. Hayden:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposal of a separate class for private schools in West Virginia.

I believe that the proposal stems from a great deal of misinformation and misconception. It appears that the main misconception stems from the idea that private schools can and do recruit. As a parent of two students at Charleston Catholic High School, I can only speak of what I have seen over the course of the years of my involvement in this school community and that is that under the watchful eye of principal Debra Sullivan, it doesn't happen. I'm sure that the facts and figures have been provided to you, but I would like to reiterate that a great percentage of high school students at CCHS have come to the school from one of the "feeder Catholic grade schools" in the Charleston area, or another private grade school or may have moved into the area due to job transfers. While Charleston Catholic athletes enjoy success on the playing field, the primary focus of this school is academia, another arena in which they are highly successful. I believe that the hard work and high!

standards which must be met in the classroom spill over into the field of athletic competition as well as the success of our students in their other endeavors. While

not every student at CCHS is a straight A student, each of them is expected to work hard in the class room and challenge themselves to achieve the highest grade possible. Again, it spills over into other aspects of their lives.

I have heard that some of the single A schools feel that they the private schools should be in a separate class because they may draw from a larger student base than "rural" single A schools. Please consider that there are some sports in which there is no class distinction (soccer, for example). Our athletes compete against schools much larger than we are, knowing that the mountain is harder to climb. The result is that our athletes work harder to climb the mountain. Sometimes they are successful, sometimes they aren't.

As a member of the SSAC, Charleston Catholic must adhere to the same requirements as the other members. We all hear allegations of recruitment that goes on at other schools, or see students moving from one school to another, or families that move from one district to another and the list goes on and on. If those allegations are made, I believe they should be investigated. I do believe, however, that the people making those allegations should have a name, address and telephone number and should not be anonymous.

It is my opinion that the creation of a separate class within the SSAC for private schools is another example of changing the rules or lowering the bar because it may be unattainable. At Charleston Catholic, and I'm sure at many other schools, we teach our children to work hard and play by the rules. All of our children aren't star athletes or straight A students, but we don't lower the standard to make it easier for them to achieve something. Life just isn't that way. Sometimes in life we may not like the rules, but we must play by them. In my own home, my children know what the rules are. I don't move the "line in the sand". Because of this, my boys know that the rules are the same for both of them regardless of the circumstance. If we change the rules because someone doesn't like them, then they really aren't rules.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to comment. I hope that when you consider all sides of this debate that you will not relegate the private schools to a separate class.

I wish to object to the pending proposal which would create a separate competition classification for athletics among West Virginia's private schools. It is clear that the proposal has either originated from - or is most strongly pursued by - schools venting "sour grapes" in failing to achieve a higher level of achievement. Their position is not well-founded.

This past school year has demonstrated that Class A public schools have competed at the highest levels in track, baseball, softball, football and other sports, as well. One need only examine the sense of pride and accomplishment in the athletic departments of Buffalo (Putnam County), Williamstown, Doddridge County and other high schools to find levels of success to which all schools, public or private, should aspire.

Athletic success ebbs and flows through cycles of the talent pool at all schools. That this proposal addresses the success of a few schools in recent years is what I find most objectionable. The "dynasties" of several schools across the state in various sports is yesterday's news, replaced by other programs. This body should not react to a "knee-jerk" at a relatively small number of schools which would not assure greater success in any event. If this organization truly has the interest of the student at heart, I fail to see an advantage to a community for

watering-down the level of play.

I wish, however, to more specifically address the belief that private schools have an advantage due to the recruiting of student-athletes. For approximately ten years, I have coached a group of boys, initially in a recreational soccer league, then through their middle school years and now as a junior varsity coach at Charleston Catholic High School. In all these years, I have neither participated in, nor observed, any attempt to "recruit" a player who had not come to us of his own - or his family's - choice. My son and my daughter have participated in numerous sports at CCHS, and my wife and I have both been extremely active in team activities. Neither of us has been aware of any effort to influence a student to leave his or her school to attend CCHS for the purpose of playing a sport. I admit that I have spoken with parents of school-age children regarding the advantages of the academic and social environment of CCHS and its "feeder" schools, but I do not believe this is under scrutiny at this time.

As far as a private school having a geographical advantage over a public school, I see no such advantage at work in Kanawha County where the "magnet school" concept draws students from all enrollment areas. I have also observed parents who establish a "residence" for their children with a relative or rent an apartment in another enrollment area, often for purposes of athletic participation. But I also have first-hand knowledge of attempts by coaches in Kanawha County athletics to recruit some of the best athletes from CCHS to change enrollment and join the teams they coach in Kanawha County public high schools.

Any formula other than enrollment will not result in parity. Soccer is the most obvious example of smaller schools competing against schools of all sizes in a common classification without regard to enrollment. It has been many years since a Class A school has advanced to the highest rounds of the State tournament in boys' or girls' soccer. This proposal should be rejected.

Re: Private School Bracket for Tournament Play

Dear Members of the State Board of Education:

The news has been replete in recent years with articles which chronicle an on-going decline in sportsmanship all across the spectrum: professional players using illegal performance enhancing drugs, a mother who was charged with planning to murder her daughter's cheerleading rival, governing bodies having to establish rules of conduct for parents, a parent causing the death of another in a fight over a children's sports event. It is a deplorable state of affairs that I am sure neither the State Board of Education nor the WVSSAC condones. It is reassuring to see that the WVSSAC's own website undercores the importance of good sportsmanship in all athletic endeavors. It's opening page on its website states in connection with its link to its section on rules that "Of course, it's sportmanship that must prevail in these sports, so ethics and integrity is also covered."

In its rules at §127-4-2 Sportmanship, it is provided in part in subsection 2.1 that "Member schools are required to conduct all relations with other schools in a spirit of good sportsmanship." And in subsection 2.4, it states that "It

schools in regular season play. Knowing they will not face them in tournament competition, can it be doubted that public schools soon will become indifferent about scheduling them for regular season play? Or worse, with official sanction of exclusionary practices, intentional about excluding them? With only a dozen or so private schools in the entire state - and having to travel from one end of the state to the other - it is not hard to imagine how difficult it would be to schedule a full regular season.

Finally, it must be remembered that not all private schools field teams in all sports. While I have no numbers, it may well be that in some sports only a very few private schools participate in a certain sport. If the number of public schools scheduling private schools during regular season in that sport should diminish, or even cease altogether, it could mean the death of some athletic programs at some schools. Then, too, if only three or four private schools field teams in a particular sport, how can there even be tournament play for that sport in an all-private school bracket?

The frustration of some schools can be appreciated. But exclusion is not the answer. Surely some alternative or compromise can be crafted. For example, why not -- in the sports where necessary or feasible -- have double representation at the start of tournament play. In other words, in some sports each region could send its top public school team and its top private school team to the state tournament. Once at the tournament, the double tracking is eliminated.

Those schools which voted for a private school bracket should be ashamed. The lesson in poor sportsmanship they are teaching the youth of this state is one which I hope the Board of Education in its wisdom and in its sense of fair play and good sportsmanship will reject.

Dear WVSSAC and WV Sate Board of Education,
I am usually not one who has any difficulty expressing myself in speech or in written form. However, I have found it fairly difficult to adequately express my thoughts on this topic and have torn up several rough drafts to you. Now, because the deadline to respond rapidly approaches, I must quickly respond.
I know the reason I am having so much difficulty responding on this topic of potentially creating a new private school class for post-season sports competition. It is quite simply because it is 2006, I am living in one of the most beautiful states in the United States, and the school all 3 of my children either currently attend or graduated from is being squarely faced with segregation. And I am, quite honestly, in disbelief. How can this possibly be?
The Charleston Catholic student athletes earn their wins and they earn their losses and thus, they compile a record. If a CCHS team's record of wins/losses earns them a berth in post season competition, it is an earned berth. If a team does not earn a berth, the athletes must decide how much it matters to them, and make a committed effort to practice even harder next year in order to earn a berth. The most successful teams go on to post-season competition; the less successful teams do not.
It is such a fair and simple concept. Despite the simplicity, there are those who are displeased with the success of CCHS athletic teams consistently advancing

in post-season play. The solution to this displeasure is to move them, pardon me- segregate them- into their own class. And how is it decided which teams will go? Well, the culprits are Catholic schools so segregating them off by themselves takes care of the problem. What on earth will happen in Class A competition if a new private school class is created, and then a single public school or two emerges as a consistent post-season competitor in 2007, 2008, and 2009? Will these schools join the private school class, too, in order to continue to clear the board so less successful teams get an opportunity to win?

Segregation is such an ugly word. I cannot believe it is even being whispered when determining where our student athletes at CCHS might be playing post - season games next year. In a segregated class, kids. Why? Because there are those who believe you are winning too often.

I respectfully urge you to disapprove of this proposal. Please understand that our students work really hard at their athletics at CCHS because they are so used to working really hard at their academics. It is just what they do because the teachers and coaches at CCHS expect the students and athletes to always give their best effort the first time, the last time, and every time in between. It is second nature to the kids.

All 3 of my children attended West Virginia Catholic schools from kindergarten. My youngest is now in 8th grade at CCHS, my middle child is in 12th grade at CCHS and my oldest graduated from Charleston Catholic. My son who is a CCHS graduate from 2002 just graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point 2 weeks ago. West Point is rigorous in both academics and athletics. My son said that his years in Catholic elementary and middle schools and his high school years at Charleston Catholic prepared him well for the rigors and high expectations of West Point. He reminded me that the transition to West Point was not as hard for him as it was for others because he came from a place where excellence and top performance was expected of him every time in the classroom as well as on the court, track, and cross country course.

At Charleston Catholic, expectations of the students and student-athletes are very high. Please do not segregate them because in the wisdom of their youth they have figured out a method to achieve success and reach those high expectations. Instead, they should be applauded and urged to continue to apply the same methods for success out in the world after graduation.

Proposal 6 amendment 127-3-10 classify private schools as AP. I am completely in favor of this amendment and for removing private schools from the single A classification of public schools. Public single A schools are at a great disadvantage to private schools. Small public schools are in rural areas with very limited populations to draw athletes from. Private schools are located in the largest population areas of the state and serve students who'd be attending triple A or double A schools. I was secretary at Moorefield High from 1993 to 2005. I am also the parent of 3 sons who participated on several football and the baseball state

tournament teams. I shared in the amazing run of this small town school and its incredible group of HOME TOWN athletes. Its a shame that the governing body of these small schools would deny another small town the opportunity to see their athletes rise to the height of their sport by the unfair and unjustifiable inclusion of private schools, schools that are not and have not for several years been held to the same rules regarding ! attendance area.

This policy should be approved. I have been a head boys varsity basketball coach in West Virginia for 23 years. The present policy that allows students to be coached 3 weeks a year was a great first step for West Virginia.

Before the 3 week coaching period in the summer was implemented, it was distressing to see athletes over the summer break begin running with the wrong crowd and become influenced by behaviors that our coaches would not allow if we could legally have contact with them. Athletics is just about the only "hook" that we have with some of our students, and to lose that over the course of the summer has prevented some students from continuing in certain programs that were forcing the athletes to maintain their academics and their behaviors to a higher standard than what they would try to maintain on their own.

The negative of the 3 week period is that the multi-sport athlete is so pressed for time trying to give 2-3 sports equal time. Extending the coaching period over the summer would relieve the pressure of the 3 week period and allow us coaches to maintain contact with the athlete over the duration of the summer.

This policy should be approved. I have been a head high school basketball coach in West Virginia for 23 years. My teams have regularly scheduled private schools such as Clarksburg Notre Dame and Parkersburg Catholic, while competing against

Morgantown St. Francis (now closed) and Wheeling Central Catholic in tournament competition. I have coached at small rural schools who do not enjoy the advantage of having an entire county (and sometimes more) counted as their legal attendance area as the private schools do.

Just 3 years ago, one of our starters from our Girls Varsity Basketball team traveled to Clarksburg every day during her junior & senior years to be a member of Notre Dame High School. Her trip took her past Elkins High School, Buchannon High School, Lewis County High School, and South Harrison High School each day. Religion had no bearing on her choice as she nor her family are Catholic or are of a religious nature.

The November/December 2005 edition of the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS), of which our WVSSAC is a proud member, has an article in regards to the public/private school athletic debate. It would be well worth your time to consider this article as it describes what many other states do to try to "level the playing field" between public and small private schools. You will find that many states have in force the policy that WV is trying to implement.

Religious discrimination has nothing to do with this policy. However the tenets of every world religion dealing with treating everyone fairly with the same advantages do come into play. I would think that any private school that prides itself on teaching religious doctrine would be embarrassed to compete with the advantages presently granted to them.

Dear Mr. Hayden:

This letter is to state my strong opposition to the proposal to create a new private school class for post-season athletic competitions in West Virginia.

- Primarily, the proposal to segregate is illegal.
- The accusations that our school system recruits students for athletic purposes is unfounded and absurd. The only "perk" an athlete in the private school system receives is a \$4,500+ tuition invoice.
- Single-A schools support small communities and small, private schools. Because of the decline in West Virginia's population, several single-A schools have consolidated and become double-A and triple-A schools. This, leaves fewer single-A schools in the pool of athletic competition.

- West Virginia is a rural state, and due the geographical location of many single-A schools and the location in which students reside, transportation to athletic practice is difficult, and, therefore, all athletic students do not participate in sporting activities. Students attending a private school should not be discriminated against because they live in a less rural area and have transportation to participate in athletics.

- Charleston Catholic High School does not win State athletic titles every year. The boys high school basketball team won the State Title in 2000 and in 2006. Clearly, this is not an indication of athletic recruiting.

- Charleston Catholic High School has won the State academic title in the Quiz Bowl for the past 5 years. I do not hear single-A schools complaining about recruiting for academics.

- When Notre Dame dominated the football arena during several years when Lou Holz was coach, other colleges of the same size did not seek to illegally ban private colleges from the NCAA.

- If coaching staff is inadequate, it should be replaced.

- Charleston Catholic, as well as other private schools, set very high standards for the students. These standards are set for discipline, academics, athletics, community service, and other life-related aspects. The students work hard to meet expectations. To punish and discriminate against their achievements is unconscionable.

- More than 80 percent of students at Charleston Catholic High School have been in a Catholic/private school since elementary school. To force children and parents to choose between family values and athletics is an injustice to West Virginia's youth.

- Home-schooled children are permitted to play athletics in the public school system and not a segregated home-school class of athletics.

- Financially, the public school system gains by receiving tax dollars from the more than 6,000 Catholic high school students who do not attend public school. This proposal to segregate private schools and create a separate private school class for athletics will provide an increase in the public school student body. This will be a huge financial expense for the public school system.

I can list many more reasons why creating a private school class for post-season athletic competition is illegal, immoral, and discriminatory, but I think my message is clear.

I am submitting this letter in opposition to the WVSSAC proposal that would create a separate competitive classification for private secondary schools. As the parent of a student-athlete at Charleston Catholic High School (CCHS), and as a former secondary school and collegiate student-athlete, I consider this proposal to be misguided, and I encourage its rejection by the State Board of Education.

This proposal appears to be motivated by an institutional focus, namely: that private schools, by virtue of their location and the "talent pool" therein, gain an unfair competitive advantage (via recruitment) over public schools with comparable enrollments, and should therefore be barred from championship competition against those schools. This reasoning is fundamentally flawed, and I wish to offer the following points in defense of the current system of classification.

First: As a sports official, I consider this proposal incongruent with sportsmanship, as I understand it. Indeed, by limiting an athlete's opportunities for competition, this proposal is clearly not focused upon the good of the athlete, that is, the sense of achievement that an athlete attains upon earning a championship in fair and open competition. Rather, in this proposal, the focus is taken away from the athlete, and is then misdirected upon the good of the institution that the athlete represents, as defined by a win-loss record. One can

only surmise that proponents of this proposal believe that a more favorable win-loss record will benefit their institution; however, such "benefits" (pride, for example) are transitory at best. Put succinctly: if the cost of pride is integrity, then I suggest that we choose integrity.

Second: As a basis for competitive classification, enrollment alone, that is, the size of a school's "talent pool," does not paint a complete picture of the athletic landscape. One must also consider resource availability, i.e., funding for extracurricular activities, and the effect that those resources (or the lack thereof) have upon athletic competition. The inescapable fact is that private schools do not have the resources of an entire county school system at their disposal. As a result, athletic programs at private schools are constantly at risk. Without the generosity of alumni and parents, it would be difficult, if not impossible, for private schools to offer athletic programs. Therefore, in this regard, private schools face a significant disadvantage in competition with public schools.

Third: The justification for this proposal stopped just short of alleging that private schools admit students on the basis of athletic ability. Such allegations are absurd, and are an affront to private schools, which operate under extremely rigorous ethical standards. Even if one were not inclined to believe this, it is a matter of fact that the application for CCHS admission does not ask for the speed of the applicant's fastball, the height of the applicant's vertical jump, or the applicant's fastest time in the 100-meter dash. Therefore, it is patently obvious that athletic ability is not a criterion for admission to CCHS. I suspect that the same can be said of every other private school in West Virginia.

Fourth: The justification for the proposal also stops just short of alleging that prospective student-athletes and their families are somehow induced to select private school enrollment over enrollment in local public schools. There are, in fact, inducements to private school enrollment; however, these inducements are intangible, and are solely grounded in the academic and ethical standards upon which the private schools are founded. No reasonable person could consider such "inducements" illegal or unethical. Furthermore, since WVSSAC rule 127-2-9 already prohibits "The use of influence by a person or group connected or not connected with the school to secure or retain a student for athletic participation ...," an administrative remedy already exists for unethical student-athlete recruitment, namely: administrative sanctions against the offending parties. As such, reclassification of all private schools for the purpose of remediating alleged infractions is, at minimum, redundant.

Fifth: the proposal implicitly suggests that private school students are, on average, more "athletically gifted" than their public school counterparts. I am not a sociologist; however, I suspect that this contention has no basis in fact. I choose to believe that every child has nearly unlimited potential, and that failure to achieve that potential is a direct consequence of inadequate adult leadership. Consequently, if one wishes to understand the root cause of athletic (or academic) failure, then one need look no further than the adults involved.

In conclusion: the athletic prowess of an educational institution, large or small, in no way reflects its success as a center of learning. Academic excellence must be the first and only measure of success for any educational institution, and for a private institution, this measure of success is particularly imperative, since enrollment is neither compulsory or inexpensive. To suggest that athletic success is a sufficient "return on investment" for the families of private school students trivializes the core values of private education, and is, in a word, outrageous. The proposal to segregate private schools for the purpose of athletic competition is equally outrageous, and I hope that the Board of Education will act accordingly, and reject the proposal.

It seems that some school administrators are focusing on (1) when they should attempt (2).

Eliminating competition will not help students to become better athletes, nor will it help them win college scholarships. In fact, eliiminating competition frequently leads to a lowering of standards and expectations.

Eliminating competition teaches students that they don't have to improve in order to win, that they only have to change the rules. This is a sad lesson to teach those students.

In fact, public school students can compete. The students at public schools are just as good athletes as those at private schools. They should NEVER be told that they are inferior; they are NOT. Those administrators and coaches who are, by this proposal, telling public school students that they can't compete should be ashamed of their conduct.

Public school students are just as talented as private. The difference is in the athletic programs, founded and run by administrators, coaches and parents. This is not a difference between public / private schools as much as it is a difference between urban / rural schools.

Take a look at the Class A schools that have either won or finished as runner-up in state championships recently. For last year, in virtually every case the school was located either in or near one of the larger cities in the state. There are numerous reasons for this. For instance:

- a) Students in smaller schools are able to play in summer leagues against athletes from larger schools; this competition encourages improvement.
- b) YMCAs and fitness facilities are available so that athletes can train all year, by true weightlifting and other activities.
- c) Students have access to pools (indoor for year round use), multiple golf courses, and tennis courts.
- d) Larger areas have a much larger pool of coaches from which to select.

Yes, rural schools are at a disadvantage with regard to these and other issues. But these are urban vs. rural differences, not public vs. private.

In all of the discussion of this proposal so far, there has been no discussion about improving the ATHLETIC PROGRAMS for the students. This is really what should be done. Schools that are successful in athletics are successful because of the athletic program the coach or school has created. A state championship team is formed not in one year, but by many years working in one system. By improving its athletic program, a school can improve its players' performance, which will lead to greater success in regional and state competition.

There are ways for a rural school to overcome the advantages of the more urban schools, but this requires more work and a lot of dedication. Some rural schools have established good programs; many have obvious and significant weaknesses, employ coaches with a limited desire to overcome those weaknesses, and believe the only way they can achieve success is by removing teams that have been successful. That's the easy way to win. The hard way is to improve your own team.

Coaches and administrators should be telling their students that they are as good as any students in private schools. And then those adults should work to put together a program that will make their schools as successful as they want to be. They can:

- a) Organize carpools and travel to larger cities for summer league basketball, not just a couple times a month, but a couple times a week.
- b) Build a true weight room and train kids how to correctly work out, then put together a program to encourage them to do that. I'm not talking about a couple weight benches and a coach who says, "Lift." I'm referring to a true weight program designed by a physical therapist or exercise physiologist who truly knows what to do. This type of program will pay dividends for students the rest of their lives.
- c) Insist that coaches go to clinics and pay for their way to do that. Have them go to seminars by college coaches. Your coaches should be learning all the time, not just about the game they coach, but about how to motivate and inspire teenagers. Sadly, some rural coaches are not teachers (either in occupation or ability); they may know something about the game, but have not developed the skills to teach, motivate and inspire. They need to continually work on and learn these skills.

There are many other things that small, rural schools can do to improve their athletic programs. Yes, it will take some money. But more importantly it will take a coach or administrator who believes that their programs can improve, someone who is willing to do the hard organizational work to make that happen.

The message school administrators should be sending to students and parents is:
"You are as good as any students in the state. Now let's work hard and prove it."

Unfortunately the message being sent by this proposal is: "You are not as good as
the students in private schools. They're better, and you can't compete with them."

Let me leave you with one final, but very important thought. The real question
should be: WHAT CAN THE WVSSAC DO TO ASSIST ALL MEMBER SCHOOLS, BUT ESPECIALLY
RURAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS, TO IMPROVE THEIR ATHLETIC PROGRAMS?

That is the real question that needs answered.

I strongly oppose the proposal to segregate private schools into a separate class for the purposes of athletics. I fail to understand how it is allegedly "unfair" that private schools may draw from a larger geographic area than Class A public schools.

Classification is based on school size, not geographic area; if a private school has the number of students to result in it falling into a certain class then that should be the only criteria considered. The proposal is clearly motivated by the basest of considerations -- some of the Class A schools have decided that they can't beat some of the private schools on the field, so elimination of the competition is a way to "get even."

As the girls' soccer coach at CCHS, my team and I are routinely faced with the prospect of playing schools that are many times bigger than the student body at CCHS. Contrary to the reaction of the schools that have submitted this proposal, however, our attitude is to relish the opportunity to play the best competition, regardless of size or the geographic area from which the students are drawn.

Additionally, contrary to the implications of the proposal (that private schools recruit athletes) our team loses, rather than gains, players to public schools

every year. Our reaction is not to try to change the rules but to work hard to improve the athletes that want to attend CCHS and to improve the team as a whole.

As far as I know no coach at CCHS recruits athletes. To the contrary, the school is sensitive, perhaps overly sensitive, to the appearance of recruiting.

This proposal would be the death knell for CCHS girls' soccer. Currently we compete at the highest level with the best teams in the state, regardless of size. The creation of a separate class for private schools would, when applied to soccer, result in the departure of every player who has any hope of playing soccer in college. The competition would be so limited and of such poor quality that no college would take notice of any of our players. This would be extremely unfair both to these athletes -- to make them choose between the excellent education afforded by CCHS and the opportunity to compete in college -- and to the school itself.

Please reject this petty, vindictive proposal.

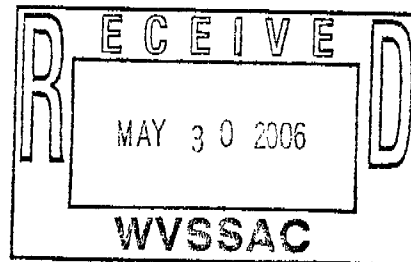

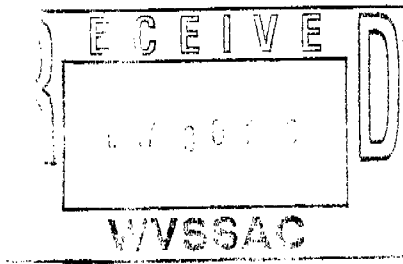

Several things make the schools on unequal ground when competing. First, private schools draw their athletes from a much larger pool than most of the public single A schools have to draw. The cities of Charleston, Huntington, Parkersburg, and Wheeling, for example, have larger populations than many of the rural counties in which public single A schools are located even though many of the single A public schools are not the ONLY school in the county. The private schools are able to draw from anywhere within their diocese, but public schools are supposed to be confined to their attendance district. Public schools are forced to accept all types of students, but private schools are able to control their enrollments through selection. There are very few, if any, special needs students within the private schools, but special needs students are counted within the enrollment figures of the public high schools, even though few of them play sports or participate in extracurricular activities. How can a private school with only 57 students according to WVSSAC classification dominate girls basketball for years as Mercer Christian did? Many of the girls from the Mercer Christian teams received athletic scholarships, and several lived out of state. Surrounding states have a format in which private schools compete in tournaments against other private schools (Maryland and Virginia for example). Funding is another issue. Private schools have the luxury of a healthy budget. Most students attending and paying tuition come from upper-middle and middle class families and are able to field teams in many sports. How many public single A schools are able to offer the variety of varsity sports that Parkersburg Catholic and Wheeling Central can offer? The playing ground between private and public single A schools has been unequal for a long time. Year in and year out a Private School is name the outstanding sports program of Single A by the Charleston newspapers. Are the athletes that much better or work harder or want to win more than public school athletes? I don't believe so. It is obvious that private schools have a distinct advantage over public Single A schools. You now have the opportunity to right a wrong and move the private schools to their own classification where they belong. Do the right thing to save small school athletics - VOTE in favor of Proposal 6 (Proposition 127-3-10.1)!!!!!!!

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION:

I am a 1976 graduate of Weir High School, a 1980 magna cum laude graduate of West Virginia University and earned my law degree from Washington and Lee University in 1983. I have served as an elected member of the Hancock County Board of Education and was appointed by Gov. Gaston Caperton as the first secretary of the West Virginia Ethics Commission. My wife and I are the parents of three teenagers.

As a practicing attorney for the past 23 years, I have defended numerous young people charged with drug or alcohol-related crimes and successfully served as a special prosecutor in a drug-related murder case where an 18-year-old was sentenced to life with mercy. It is my considered opinion that by far the most reliable "anti-drug" for young people is their participation in competitive sports and other similar extracurricular activities.

I have come to believe that there may be, contrary to popular belief, an underemphasis on sports in our schools. In juvenile cases over the years I have had parent after parent tell me that they first "lost control" of their teenager when he or she quit sports in high school. As adults it is our responsibility to enable all children, regardless of whether they attend a public or private school, the best opportunities to stay busy and healthy. The AP proposal is a giant step bakwards in that regard. I STRONGLY OPPOSE the AP proposal and believe it will, in the long-term, severely limit the ability of smaller public schools in our state to realize their potential in sports such as tennis, and will limit young people in private schools from eventually competing at all in sports such as wrestling where only one or two private schools may even be able to field a team for the state tournament in Huntington.

While I sympathize with the feelings of the AP proponents in major sports such as football (and support a 4-class system), I believe the adoption of the AP class will have a long-term negative impact on sports participation for the youth of our state and hope that the state Board of Education will show the wisdom to reject such a proposal.

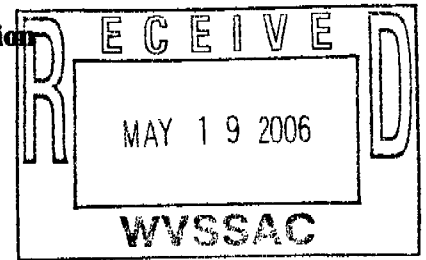

2. This would also give everyone an additional game of revenue without extending our season.
3. Hopefully, this would encourage teams to play local opponents and reduce travel, thus eliminate dodging high caliber opponents.

I would like to address the recent proposal of limiting softball players to 32 games per season, with limited consideration to non-starting players. Before, there was no limitation to players, just the number of games a team could play. This new proposal has its merit, as a player could play in 32 varsity games as well as 32 junior varsity/ reserve games for a total of 64 games. This is a lot of games in a softball season. But, without actually having the facts, players participating fully in 64 games would seem to be more the exception than the rule.

What this new proposal does is not give any consideration to the number of athletes who will realistically be denied an opportunity to participate in high school softball. Being a courtesy runner or pinch runner does very little to develop a non-starter's skills. High school athletics are about competition, otherwise why we would have sectional, regional, and state level tournaments, all geared toward winning a state championship? But high school athletics are also about giving the student-athlete an opportunity to participate in extra curricular activities to further develop his/ her life skills, not just the athletic skills.

The players on the bench need to play if they are going to develop and keep self-esteem. I personally like to see all players play, even if it is in a JV game. At a class A school, like mine, and I would suspect many other schools are similar, I keep players on the roster who will never develop the skill necessary to play in a varsity contest. Yet, I keep them on the roster so that they can belong to something. But they want to play too. So I scheduled some JV games so that these girls can play and also to develop a few girls for a future varsity team. I will no longer be able to this under the new proposal unless I shorten the varsity schedule, which isn't fair either. The problem is while I had 20 players, my three backup pitchers all started in the field in the varsity. I cannot weaken my varsity for the sake of a JV game. This past season we only played JV five games and unfortunately had five girls quit because they lost interest.

A problem unique to baseball and softball is that of pitcher specifically; more so in softball. Being a pitcher requires a lot of practice, and if the backup pitcher is good enough to play in the field, then she should. A team like mine, may have nine or more players on a varsity bench, but none of which are a pitcher. It's also not fair to make a mockery of the game and pitch someone who isn't a pitcher. I would like to go one step further and suggest that the same is also true for the catcher's position.

It has been said that there is a safety issue as to why the player limitation is being proposed. I can certainly understand limiting a player to a certain number of varsity games. I can also understand trying to curb any abuse of the current rule by fielding a varsity team in a JV game. The safety argument, depending on the situation, and in my opinion doesn't hold true for softball.

I would like to counter this with the following:

1. Players can play in varsity doubleheaders- why can't a few players play in a varsity/ JV doubleheader?

2. Pitchers (who with catchers) have the most physically demanding position, are limited to 14 innings per day- an equivalent of two games. Other position players should easily be able to handle the demand of 2 games per day.
3. In the state tournament, if the team coming out of the loser's bracket wins the first championship game, they will play a third game on the same day, with only the 14 inning pitching regulation as the only safety regulation. What about the other players?
4. Softball has become a big summer sport. It is not uncommon to see the same teams playing 3 or 4 games per day on back to back days. The reason- softball is not as strenuous or physically demanding as other sports. Surely teams carry extra pitchers and catchers to address this concern. Just because it is done in the summer doesn't make it right, but it must be noted that it is probably more grueling in the summer due to heat and sun conditions.
5. Basketball, a much more physically demanding sport than softball, allows a player to play in five quarters per day. Why couldn't a softball equivalent be considered?
6. Soccer, also a much more physically demanding sport than softball, allows a player to play in three halves per day. Why couldn't a softball equivalent be considered?
7. Volleyball, while not as demanding as basketball or soccer, is arguably more demanding than softball. Volleyball allows players to play quadrangular matches as one date.

I am sure that there are more arguments as well against this proposal. I would like to make the following counter- proposals to allow varsity/ JV games on the same day and not have them count as two games on the 32 game rule. These suggestions are not intended to be considered as one but as independent suggestions that can be combined in any way.

1. Anyone who plays in both games must play different positions in the two games. This would certainly help a team like mine whose backup pitcher plays a different position, and it would keep a coach from overusing a player at the same position for the sake of winning a game.
2. The majority of the players (five or more) in a JV game should be JV players who did not play in the varsity game. Courtesy and pinch runners' innings will not count. You may want to amend this to say that the majority should not have played in more than 3 innings in the varsity game.
3. Any player who played in a varsity contest cannot play in more than 4 innings of a JV game or it will count as an extra game. I am personally not in favor of this, but look at this as corresponding rule to the soccer, volleyball and basketball extra playing time on a game day.
4. A school can play a 3 (or 4) inning game following a varsity game and it will not count as separate. (The point here is to allow the girls on the bench to play.)
5. Anyone who had more than one at bat in the varsity game cannot bat before a JV player in the JV game batting order.
6. Anyone in uniform must play at least one inning. If the purpose of allowing varsity players to play in JV games is to allow JV players to play, then all girls should play.
7. Players cannot play in more than 5 games in any 3 day period. This would allow a team to play varsity/ JV double headers on consecutive days, but not more than 2 days in a row.

I have been told by a few coaches that if this rule goes into effect that will be forced to cut more players as players on the bench who have little or nothing to look forward to usually become problems. I don't ever want to resort to this. Once again, we should try to understand this issue from two points of view. Varsity teams, programs, players and coaches play to win. If this isn't true then do away with state championships. High school athletics can also be very important toward individuals' overall social development. Many small schools simply don't have the numbers, coaches, or financial resources to properly field two distinct teams. We played our five games back to back with varsity games for these very reasons.

Substitutions in a softball game are more difficult than in other sports because of the dynamics of the game. Mistakes can be more glaring and obvious. It is extremely rare to sub for a player in the middle of a defensive inning. Therefore it is important to develop and play the vast majority of non-starters in JV level games.

Please consider amending the individual player 32 game limit proposal so that smaller schools can support a JV team and allow more girls to participate. I'm sure with proper thought and deliberation that a solution can be reached that would allow as many girls to participate as possible. I will be more than happy to discuss any of this with anyone at anytime.

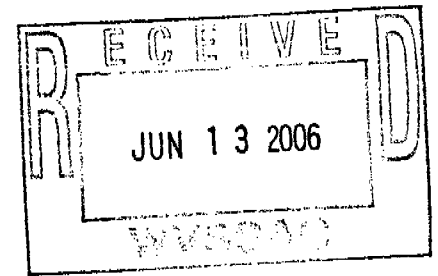

Dear Mr. Hayden:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposal of a separate class for private schools in West Virginia.

I believe that the proposal stems from a great deal of misinformation and misconception. It appears that the main misconception stems from the idea that private schools can and do recruit. As a parent of two students at Charleston Catholic High School, I can only speak of what I have seen over the course of the years of my involvement in this school community and that is that under the watchful eye of principal Debra Sullivan, it doesn't happen. I'm sure that the facts and figures have been provided to you, but I would like to reiterate that a great percentage of high school students at CCHS have come to the school from one of the "feeder Catholic grade schools" in the Charleston area, or another private grade school, or may have moved into the area due to job transfers. While Charleston Catholic athletes enjoy success on the playing field, the primary focus of this school is academia, another arena in which they are highly successful. I believe that the hard work and high standards which must be met in the classroom spill over into the field of athletic competition as well as the success of our students in their other endeavors. While not every student at CCHS is a straight A student, each of them is expected to work hard in the class room and challenge themselves to achieve the highest grade possible. Again, it spills over into other aspects of their lives.

I have heard that some of the single A schools feel that they the private schools should be in a separate class because they may draw from a larger student base than "rural" single A schools. Please consider that there are some sports in which there is no class distinction (soccer, for example). Our athletes compete against schools much larger than we are, knowing that the mountain is harder to climb. The result is that our athletes work harder to climb the mountain. Sometimes they are successful, sometimes they aren't.

As a member of the SSAC, Charleston Catholic must adhere to the same requirements as


the other members. We all hear allegations of recruitment that goes on at other schools, or see students moving from one school to another, or families that move from one district to another and the list goes on and on. If those allegations are made, I believe they should be investigated. I do believe, however, that the people making those allegations should have a name, address and telephone number and should not be anonymous.

It is my opinion that the creation of a separate class within the SSAC for private schools is another example of changing the rules or lowering the bar because it may be unattainable. At Charleston Catholic, and I'm sure at many other schools, we teach our children to work hard and play by the rules. All of our children aren't star athletes or straight A students, but we don't lower the standard to make it easier for them to achieve something. Life just isn't that way. Sometimes in life we may not like the rules, but we must play by them. In my own home, my children know what the rules are. I don't move the "line in the sand". Because of this, my boys know that the rules are the same for both of them regardless of the circumstance. If we change the rules because someone doesn't like them, then they really aren't rules.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to comment. I hope that when you consider all sides of this debate that you will not relegate the private schools to a separate class.

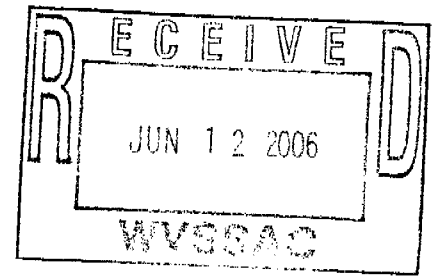

Dear WVSSAC,



I think on examination you would find we have good, but very average athletes. We have athletes who perform in their sports as they do in the classroom. They are hardworking and drive to excel in all that they do.

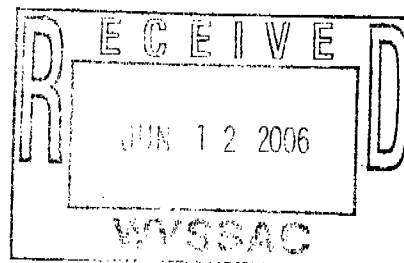

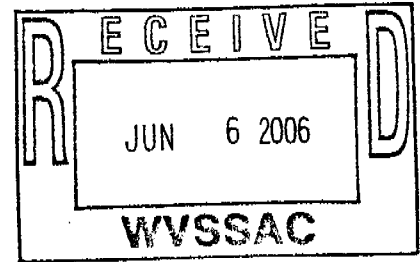
Dear Director:

Dear Sir:

We are the proud parents of two students enrolled in Charleston Catholic High School who participate in a variety of school sports under WVSSAC regulation. We write in opposition to the above proposal that is at best flawed and at the worst representative of patent, parochial bias.

It is unclear what interests of secondary school athletics will be advanced by this proposal. Obviously, the long standing concept of dividing schools for competition has always been to put schools of the same size in a common class. This proposal attempts to make a new division whose only criteria is the public or private nature of a member school. Meanwhile, all public schools continue to be grouped for post season competition based on the size of the student body. Why is the size of a student body from which athletes can be drawn suddenly irrelevant for private schools, but of continued relevance for public schools?

We have heard some proponents of this proposal argue that private schools can attract athletes by tuition incentives or scholarships. We know that in the case of our school students do not receive tuition incentives based on athletic prowess. Where is the data or objective evidence the WVSSAC relied upon to indicate there is some pattern or practice of granting such incentives? If the board approves this proposal, everyone realizes that litigation will result and the WVSSAC and the Board of Education will be asked to produce the data that supported the necessity of this proposal. How is the integrity of the board and the commission going to appear when everyone realizes there is no objective or verified data?

Even if there was data, anecdotal or otherwise, that suggested some instances of such incentives being offered by some private schools, why would the logical remedy be the ban of all private schools from any real post season competition other than between themselves? If the true

goal of the commission was to prevent potential unfairness arising from such a practice, then it could have proposed a regulation that prohibited that activity by member schools. Already, a variety of specific regulations exist that protect members schools from unfair practices. Crafting one for a documented and meaningful problem would not have been difficult.


The disparity of the proposal becomes even more significant when one reflects upon the fact that, presently, all private schools are Class A schools. The number of Class A school athletes and teams in many sports are presently at minimum levels to insure adequate post season competition. To remove the small public and private schools from competition with each other, simply results in mediocre post season events for both classes since the caliber and quantity of available athletes will be reduced for both.

We will leave for others to discuss the legal prohibitions against the proposal. Suffice it to say that any attorney who spends the time to review this issue in light of the existing court decisions and statutes will discover that the proposal, even if enacted, would never withstand the scrutiny of judicial review. In light of this likely result, the board needs to consider why it would want to adopt a proposal that seeks to fix what is at best the potential for a crack in the system with a sledge hammer approach that will lead to the animosity of thousands of adults and students.

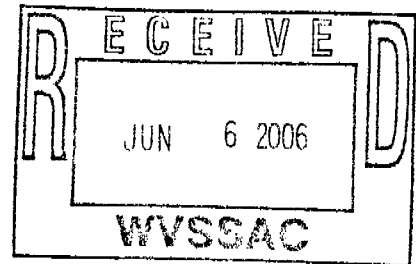
The WVSSAC supposedly stands to promote healthy, fair and unbiased athletic competition. Yet, in the end, the only result the commission's proposal achieves is to turn back years of progress to oust private schools from meaningful participation in secondary school championship events in order to benefit a group of public schools of the same size. This effort is plainly fueled by a bias held by some against private, religion based schools whose motivated athletes and teams often figure prominently in post season competition in various sports. This kind of parochial effort by the commission is the kind of embarrassing conduct that gives life to those awful stereotypes about our wonderful state.

Let us make one final point very clear. We believe it is incumbent on the board to do more than merely reject the commission proposal. This petty effort has undermined the credibility of the WVSSAC to many and, most particularly, to the over one thousand private school students in this state and their families. Accordingly, the board should adopt a resolution that reaffirms the equality of participation of private school members and specifically admonishes the effort by the WVSSAC in this instance. Only by taking this kind of clear action, will this sad chapter come to a close.


This letter is to state my strong opposition to the proposal to create a new private school class for post-season athletic competitions in West Virginia.

- Primarily, the proposal to segregate is illegal.
- The accusations that our school system recruits students for athletic purposes is unfounded and absurd. The only "perk" an athlete in the private school system receives is a \$4,500+ tuition invoice.
- Single-A schools support small communities and small, private schools. Because of the decline in West Virginia's population, several single-A schools have consolidated and become double-A and triple-A schools. This, leaves fewer single-A schools in the pool of athletic competition.
- West Virginia is a rural state, and due the geographical location of many single-A schools and the location in which students reside, transportation to athletic practice is difficult, and, therefore, all athletic students do not participate in sporting activities. Students attending a private school should not be discriminated against because they live in a less rural area and have transportation to participate in athletics.
- Charleston Catholic High School does not win State athletic titles every year. The boys high school basketball team won the State Title in 2000 and in 2006. Clearly, this is not an indication of athletic recruiting.
- Charleston Catholic High School has won the State academic title in the Quiz Bowl for the past 5 years. I do not hear single-A schools complaining about recruiting for academics.
- When Notre Dame dominated the football arena during several years when Lou Holz was coach, other colleges of the same size did not seek to illegally ban private colleges from the NCAA.

- If coaching staff is inadequate, it should be replaced.
- Charleston Catholic, as well as other private schools, set very high standards for the students. These standards are set for discipline, academics, athletics, community service, and other life-related aspects. The students work hard to meet expectations. To punish and discriminate against their achievements is unconscionable.
- More than 80 percent of students at Charleston Catholic High School have been in a Catholic/private school since elementary school. To force children and parents to choose between family values and athletics is an injustice to West Virginia's youth.
- Home-schooled children are permitted to play athletics in the public school system and not a segregated home-school class of athletics.
- Financially, the public school system gains by receiving tax dollars from the more than 6,000 Catholic high school students who do not attend public school. This proposal to segregate private schools and create a separate private school class for athletics will provide an increase in the public school student body. This will be a huge financial expense for the public school system.

I can list many more reasons why creating a private school class for post-season athletic competition is illegal, immoral, and discriminatory, but I think my message is clear.

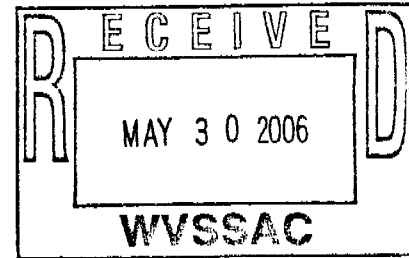

Dear Mr. Hayden:

I am writing to express my opposition to the current proposal to create a new private school class for post-season athletic competitions in West Virginia.

Some reasons for my opposition include:

1) **Treating private schools differently, including segregation of private schools into a separate class, is unlawful.** WV State Code 18-2-25, which delegates authority to the WVSSAC and specifically cites expectations regarding participation by private and parochial schools, states that: "... (private and parochial secondary schools are) subject to the same regulations and requirements and upon the payment of the same fees and charges as those provided for public secondary schools." Under the current manner of classification, SSAC divisions are based on enrollment figures only. Changing the definition for one segment of SSAC member schools, while leaving the current definition intact for other schools, is contrary to West Virginia State Code. Private schools are equal members having the same expectations and requirements as their public school counterparts and have the right to expect fair and equal treatment.

2) **The proposal is divisive.** West Virginia schools, both public and private, should be united in providing the best possible academic and extracurricular activities for our youth. Sports can be a unifying vehicle, one that creates a healthy spirit of competition while promoting friendships among students from different schools all over the state. The creation of a separate class serves to divide rather than unite student athletes. One of the SSAC's goals is (3.2.1) "... To stress the cultural values, the appreciations and skills involved in these interscholastic activities and to promote cooperation and friendship." The proposal fails to meet this expectation.

3) Instead of **penalizing schools for their successes**, which is what the proposal does, analyzing these successes could be helpful. Why are some schools – public as well as private -- more successful than others? How can other schools be more successful, not just athletically but curricularly? Schools can learn so much from each other and athletics offer the perfect venue for school personnel, coaches, student athletes, and parents to get glimpses into other ways of doing things and to develop relationships beyond their immediate circles. Similarly, the only way to get better athletically is to play against tough opponents. True competitors, true athletes, know this.

4) **The message this proposal sends to public school student athletes is a negative one which may have repercussions throughout their lives.** Underlying the proposal is the unfortunate, misguided message that public school athletes aren't good enough to compete in a larger arena. It's telling them to look for excuses. Involvement on athletic teams, working with excellent coaches and diligent teammates and playing in competitive contests, is a way to help young people develop positive, responsible attitudes that will help them achieve great things throughout their lives.

5) **All SSAC member schools are held accountable to the same rules and expectations.** These rules, properly and consistently enforced across all schools – public and private, large and small, rural and urban – should be sufficient to deal with incidents of wrong-doing.

In summary, the proposed change is ill-advised and should not be approved by the State Board of Education.

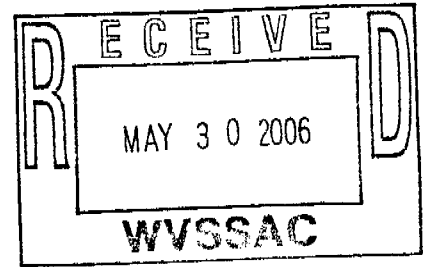

Mr. Hayden,

I am writing in response to the proposal for creating a new private school class for post-season athletic competitions in West Virginia. I am truly shocked that this proposal has made it far enough to even be considered. My assumption is that in someone's mind, private schools have a competitive advantage over other class A schools? Private schools do not recruit athletes; there are no scholarships given for athletic participation. Students are absolutely required to maintain their academic standing in order to even participate on sports teams. If we looked at all the athletes on the public school teams, would we find the same standards? I attended public schools all my life and I know there are good athletes that always "make the grade" regardless of their academic standing. I can also point to several high school athletes whose parents make special living accommodations just so their child can participate in athletics in specific schools.

The fact of the matter is, many parents/children who are very interested in athletics choose to go to public schools over private schools. They feel they do not get enough "athletic exposure and competition" in private schools. There have been several students that my children have gone to school with, that have moved from a private school to the public school system because they did not feel the private school had a "good athletic program." Do you see any private grade school sporting events?

Let's take a look a past history in just one sporting category, boys' basketball. Over the past seventeen years in the class AAA boys division the following teams have participated in the Championship game:

Woodrow Wilson	10 times
Capitol	3 times
Fairmont	3 times
George Washington	3 times

Over the past seventeen years in the class A boys division the following teams have participated in the Championship game:

Wheeling Central	6 times
Parkersburg Catholic	4 times
Charleston Catholic	4 times

This is only one example, but all other sporting categories show the same type of results. It only stands to reason that if private schools are segregated for athletic advantage, then public schools in other divisions (with better records than the private schools) will also be segregated. Otherwise, this proposal would prove to be flawed, discriminatory, and illegal. The class category of high schools across the state has always been based on the number of students attending the school and should continue this way.
