**BACKGROUND**

The majority of public and most private schools in West Virginia belong to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission. Each year, the principals of member schools submit revisions to the rules and regulations. The submitted proposals are presented and voted upon at the annual Board of Control meeting. Any approved changes are then submitted to the West Virginia State Board of Education for their review and approval.

**PURPOSE**

These amendments are brought forth to keep the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission current and updated on changes, trends and problems in the band and athletic programs.

These proposals were distributed for public comment in April and May. The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission will present to the Board the comments received for your review at the June meeting.

The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission staff, Constitution and Bylaws Committee, and Board of Control respectfully request that the proposed rule changes to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission Rules and Regulations Handbook be approved.

**CONTENT**

Seventeen proposals are being submitted to the State Board by the Secondary School Activities Commission. Each rule change is presented with the whole rule being included. This will help the State Board members understand the significance of the rule change.

The following is a brief summary of the effect of each proposal:

1. Changes the number of administrative districts from five to eight. (Vote: Yes-65 No-14)
2. Provides for a performance evaluation of the Executive Secretary and the Assistant Executive Secretaries. (Vote: Yes-75 No-2)
3. Allows the person who proposed a rule to present the proposal to the WV State Board of Education. (Vote: Yes-41 No-33)
4. Allows the Executive Secretary the latitude to grant exceptions to the rules based upon past Board of Appeals decisions. (Vote: Yes-57 No-20)
5. Allows junior highs and middle schools to combine students from two or more schools within a county to form one interscholastic team in a sport if insufficient numbers exist at each of the feeder schools. (Vote: Yes-39 No-32)

6. Clarifies means of establishing eligibility if parents move out of the school zone. (Vote: Yes-70 No-6)
7. Defines eligibility of a student who resides with natural parents, guardian, adoptive parents or placement. (Vote: Yes-48 No-27)
8. Grants eligibility to any student who resides with his/her parents and transfers on or before the eleventh instructional day beginning the school term and clarifies the establishment of eligibility as the first participation in a scrimmage or contest. (Vote: Yes-40 No-27)
9. Brings WVSSAC sanction rules into compliance with National Federation regulations. (Vote: Yes-72 No 0)
10. Clarifies that the basketball tournament allowance is for high school varsity teams only. (Vote: Yes-69 No-2)
11. Allows two cross country scrimmages. (Vote: Yes-68 No-2)
12. Changes the first contest date for high school soccer. (Vote: Yes-68 No-2)
13. Changes the beginning of the junior high soccer season to allow for extra conditioning. (Vote: Yes-51 No-13)
14. Allows one alumni game for high school softball. (Vote: Yes-54 No-16)
15. Changes the season dates for high school swimming. (Vote: Yes-63 No-0)
16. Allows two swimming scrimmages. (Vote: Yes-69 No-0)
17. Establishes consistency of inclusion of the Non-Participation Rule under each team sport regulations. (Vote: Yes-71 No-0)

## IMPACT

### Instruction

None

### Leadership

The addition of three Board of Appeals members would influence the leadership of the WVS-SAC.

### Financial

One of the proposals would collectively result in increased expenses of \$16,500. Specific amount of increase for this proposal is explained on the Fiscal Note Worksheet.

### Administrative

Athletic directors/principals will need to be aware of the changes in order to administer their school programs in accordance with the current rules. There is no major change that would impact administration negatively or cause extra administrative work at the school level.

PROVISIONS GOVERNING CONTESTS

**§127-3-1 General.**

1.1 **Scope** - These rules govern the conduct of athletic contests.

1.2 **Authority** - WV Code §18-2-25

1.3 **Filing Date** -

1.4 **Effective Date** - July 1, 1987

**§127-3-17 Sanctioning and Travel.**

17.1A member school shall not enter an event which requires sanctioning until it is approved.

17.2All applications for sanctioning must be submitted to the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission 30 days prior to the event with the exception of international events.

**Proposal 9**

Amend §127-3-17 Sanctioning and Travel (pg. 35) as follows:

17.3 Events requiring National Federation approval are:

- (a) ~~Any interstate event in which four or more schools participate (any school from a non-neighboring state).~~  
**Co-sponsorship Sanction Requirement:** Any interstate competition involving two (2) or more schools which is co-sponsored by an organization outside the high school community (e.g., a university, a theme park, a shoe company), in addition to being sponsored by a member school, an approved school or a state association, shall require sanction of the NFHS office.
- (b) ~~Any interstate event which involves schools from three or more state high school associations and any one of them does not border on the state of the sponsoring school.~~  
**Non-bordering State Sanction Requirement:** Each state association shall sanction through the NFHS office interstate competition by a member school involving either:
  - 1) Eight (8) or more schools, at least one (1) of which is from a state that does not border the host state;
  - or
  - 2) Five (5) or more states, at least one (1) of which does not border the host state.
- (c) ~~Any international event, except competition with Canadian high schools, must be sanctioned and submitted 60 days prior to the event.~~  
**International Event:** Each member state association shall approve and receive NFHS approval for competition by a member school against a school from a foreign country, except for two (2) school and three (3) school competition with a school or schools from Canada or Mexico which necessitates a round trip of less than 600 miles.
- (d) **International Event:** Games against Canadian or Mexican schools involving travel of greater than 600 miles, or an event involving more than three (3) schools, one or more of which are from Canada or Mexico, requires a request to the NFHS for international sanction and notice to and sanction by the appropriate National Governing Body.

**Rationale:**

Rule change will bring WVSSAC sanction rules into compliance with National Federation regulations.

17.4 Bordering state events requiring approval are:

- (a) Any interstate event in which four or more schools participate. (All schools from neighboring states.)
- (b) Any interstate event which involves schools from three or more state high school associations.

17.5 Intrastate events requiring approval are:

- (a) An event with more than four schools participating or awards given.
- (b) Any event where awards are given.

17.6 The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission may assess a fine and/or other penalties against the participating school for violations of the sanction provisions.

17.7A member school shall not enter an event that involves travel of more than 600 miles round trip unless it occurs on days when school is not in session. However, sanctioning from the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission must be granted.

**§127-3-1 General.**

**1.1 Scope -** These rules govern the conduct of athletic contests.

**1.2 Authority -** WV Code §18-2-25

**1.3 Filing Date -**

**1.4 Effective Date -** July 1, 1987

**§127-3-21 Basketball (Boys and Girls).**

**21.1 Rules:** Basketball rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided by Commission modification.

**21.2 Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice for girls will begin on Monday of Week 19 and Monday of Week 20 for boys. The first contest for girls may be played on Tuesday of Week 23 and Tuesday of Week 24 for boys.

**21.3 Length of Season:** The boys and girls basketball season will end for each team at tournament elimination.

**Proposal 10**

Amend §127-3-21 Basketball (pg. 38) as follows:

**21.4 Maximum Team Contests:** A varsity basketball team will be permitted to play no more than 20 games in the regular season with the following exceptions: (1) If a team participates in a four team tournament and no more than 2 games played by each team, 21 games will be allowed in regular season. (2) If a team participates in an eight team tournament and no more than 3 games played by each team, 22 games will be allowed in regular season. Sectional, regional and state tournament contests are not included in the above number. All other high school teams are limited to 20 games.

**Rationale:**

The change clarifies the intent of the rule.

- (a) The maximum number of quarters for a player in one season is 100 exclusive of sectional, regional and state tournament contests. However, if participating in a tournament, the limit will be 104 (4 team tournament) and 108 (8 team tournament).
- (b) A player may play only 5 quarters in one day.
- (c) Participation in a quarter, regardless of time, will be considered one quarter.
- (d) Overtime is considered as an extension of the fourth quarter.
- (e) One alumni game may be played and not counted against the total number of games. The game must be a team representing a member school and a team composed of alumni of that school. This game may be played no earlier than the date specified for the first contest.

**21.5A** high school basketball team is permitted to participate in a preview and a scrimmage or two scrimmage games with the following conditions:

- 1. Scrimmage:
  - (a) Not under game conditions
  - (b) Prior to the first game
  - (c) Admission may be charged
  - (d) Use of registered officials would not be a violation of the game conditions
  - (e) After seven (7) days of practice
- 2. Preview:
  - (f) All of the above
  - (g) Must be 3 or more teams
  - (h) Teams desiring to participate would be allowed to play two quarters of the basketball time.

21.6 Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

21.7 A student may not play or practice on a non-school team while a member of his school team.

21.8 A student may accept awards only in WVSSAC sanctioned events during the season of that sport. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule. Students may accept only this same type of an award in non-sanctioned event outside the sport season.

#### **JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS**

21.9 The above rules will apply for Junior High Schools with the following adaptations:

- (a) Girls may begin practice on Monday of Week 19 and boys on Monday of Week 20. The first contest for girls will be played on Wednesday of Week 21 and Wednesday of Week 22 for boys.
- (b) The girls' basketball season will end on Saturday of Week 33 and Saturday of Week 34 for boys.
- (c) Tournament play on the state level shall be prohibited.
- (d) Boys and girls basketball teams will be permitted to play no more than 20 games. Tournament exception does not apply.
- (e) All junior high players may play a maximum of 80 quarters for one season.
- (f) All junior high players may play a maximum of 4 quarters per day.
- (g) Games involving only students below the 9th grade shall be played in 6-minute quarters. A member school sponsoring games involving teams which combine 9th grade students with students in the 8th and/or 7th grades may play those games in quarters of 8 minutes.
- (h) Junior highs are not permitted to play an alumni game.
- (i) Scrimmages: Junior high teams are permitted one (1) scrimmage under the same conditions as a high school.
- (j) A ninth grade team in a high school program will follow the rules provided for junior high schools.

**§127-3-23 Cross Country (Boys and Girls).**

**23.1 Rules:** Cross Country rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided by Commission modification.

**23.2 Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 7 and the first meet may be held on Wednesday of Week 9.

**23.3 Length of Season:** The Cross Country season will end for each team or individual at tournament elimination.

**23.4 Maximum Team Contests:** No limit.

**Proposal 11**

Amend §127-3-23 Cross Country (Boys and Girls) (pg. 40) as follows:

**23.5 Scrimmages:** ~~Not permitted.~~ Two cross country scrimmages with another high school may be conducted with the following conditions: after 7 days of practice; prior to the first meet ; without keeping score.

**Rationale:**

The allowance of scrimmages is consistent with other sports.

**23.6** Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

**23.7A** student may accept awards in WVSSAC sanctioned events and non-sanctioned events during the entire year. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule.

**§127-3-26 Soccer (Boys and Girls).**

26.1 **Rules:** Soccer rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided by Commission modifications.

**Proposal 12**

Amend §127-3-26 Soccer (Boys and Girls) (pg. 44) as follows:

26.2 **Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 5 and the first contest may be played on ~~Wednesday of Week 8. (1998 season - Friday of Week 7).~~

**Rationale:**

Change of first contest date to reflect an emergency rule change enacted by the Board of Appeals and Constitution and Bylaws Committee for the 1998 season. The earlier date allows for the season to begin and end without conflict of other sports.

26.3 **Length of Season:** The soccer season will end for each team at tournament elimination or the Saturday prior to the playoff competition.

26.4 **Maximum Team Contest:** A soccer team will be permitted to play no more than 18 matches exclusive of sectional, regional, and state tournaments.

(a) The maximum number of quarters for a player in one season will be 72, exclusive of sectional, regional, and state tournaments.

(b) A player shall not be permitted to participate in more than four quarters during any one day. Any part of a quarter counts as one quarter. In an overtime game, the overtime shall be considered an extension of the fourth quarter.

26.5 **Scrimmages:** Two soccer scrimmages with another high school may be conducted with the following conditions: after 7 days of practice; prior to the first game; without keeping score in a book or on a scoreboard; using some format other than quarters; the use of registered officials would not be a violation of game conditions.

26.6 Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

26.7 A student may not play or practice on a non-school soccer team while a member of his school team.

26.8 A student may accept awards only in WVSSAC sanctioned events during the season of that sport. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule. Students may accept only this same type of award in non-sanctioned events outside the sport season.

**Proposal 13**

Amend §127-3-26 Soccer (Boys and Girls) (pg. 44) as follows:

26.9 The above will apply for junior high schools with the following adaptations:

- (a) Junior high teams may play 14 matches including tournaments sanctioned by the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission.
- (b) Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 7 6 and the first contest may be played on Monday of Week 10.
- (c) Junior high season will be completed by Saturday of Week 17.
- (d) The maximum number of quarters for a player in one season will be 56.
- (e) Junior high teams are permitted one (1) scrimmage under the same conditions as a high school.

**Rationale:**

To allow an extra week of conditioning. This will make the season start the same as junior high football and practices are easier to schedule before school starts.

**§127-3-27 Softball.**

27.1 **Rules:** Softball rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided herein.

27.2 **Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 35 and the first contest may be played on Wednesday of Week 37.

27.3 **Length of Season:** The softball season will end for each team upon the completion of the State Tournament.

27.4 **Maximum Team Contests:** A softball team will be permitted to play no more than 31 games if participating in a conference tournament; otherwise, the regular season will be 30 games exclusive of sectional, regional and state contests. The conference tournament is to count as one (1) game.

**Proposal 14**

Amend §127-3-27 Softball (pg. 44) as follows (renumber):

27.5 One alumni game may be played and not counted against the total number of games. The game must be a team representing a member school and a team composed of alumni of the member school and/or alumni of schools consolidated to form the member school. This game may be played no earlier than the date specified for the first contest.

**Rationale:**

To help promote community relations. Softball is a sport which older people can play, much like basketball, and it helps keep the alumni involved in a school activity.

27.6 Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

27.7A student may not play or practice on a non-school softball team while a member of his school team.

27.8A student may accept awards only in WVSSAC sanctioned events during the season of that sport. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule. Students may accept only this same type of an award in non-sanctioned event outside the sport season.

**JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS**

27.9 The above will apply for junior high schools with the following adaptations:

- (a) Junior high teams may play 18 games including tournaments sanctioned by the West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission.
- (b) Junior high season will be completed by Saturday of Week 45.
- (c) Junior high teams are permitted one (1) scrimmage under the same conditions as a high school.

**28.1 Rules:** Swimming rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided by Commission modification.

**Proposal 15**

Amend §127-3-28 Swimming (Boys and Girls) (pg. 45) as follows:

**28.2 Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week ~~18~~ 17 and the first contest may be on Wednesday of Week ~~29~~ 19. (~~Week 17 and Week 19 for 1998~~).

**28.3 Length of Season:** The swimming season will end Saturday of Week ~~34~~ 33. (~~Week 33 for 1998~~).

**Rationale:**

The rule change is proposed to reflect an emergency rule change enacted by the Board of Appeals and Constitution and Bylaws Committee for the 1998-99 season. The change of practice/contest dates and the length of season was necessitated by facility availability and tournament date conflicts.

**28.4 Maximum Team Contests:** A swimming team will be permitted 16 contests exclusive of sectional, regional, and state contests.

**Proposal 16**

Amend §127-3-28 Swimming (Boys and Girls) (pg. 45) as follows:

**28.5 Scrimmages:** ~~Not permitted.~~ Two swimming scrimmages with another high school may be conducted with the following conditions: after 7 days of practice; prior to the first meet; without keeping score in a book or on a scoreboard; the use of registered officials would not be a violation of game conditions.

**Rationale:**

The allowance of scrimmages is consistent with other sports.

**28.6 Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.**

**28.7A student may accept awards in WVSSAC sanctioned events and non-sanctioned events during the entire year. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule.**

**§127-3-31 Volleyball (Girls).**

31.1**Rules:** Volleyball rules published by the National Federation of State High School Associations are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise provided by Commission modification.

31.2**Organized Team Practice:** Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 7 and the first contest may be played on Wednesday of Week 9.

31.3**Length of Season:** The volleyball season will end for each team by tournament elimination.

31.4**Maximum Team Contest:** A volleyball team will be permitted 22 matches exclusive of sectional, regional, and state contests.

Dual, triangular and quadrangular matches count as one. Matches in which five or more schools participate count as two.

(a) One alumni game may be played and not counted against the total number of games. The game must be between a team representing a member school and a team composed of alumni of the member school and/or alumni of schools consolidated to form the member school. The game may be played no earlier than the date specified for the first contest.

31.5In dual competition, a player may participate in a maximum of three (3) games against the same opponent if a match is 2 of 3 games and five (5) games if the varsity match is 3 of 5 games.

31.6Scrimmages: Two volleyball scrimmages with another high school may be conducted with the following conditions: after 7 days of practice; prior to the first game; no score kept; free substitution; time outs are permitted; the use of registered officials would not be a violation of game conditions.

31.7Individual players of a team must have practiced on 14 SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

**Proposal 17**

Amend §127-3-31 Volleyball (Girls) (pg. 48) by adding the following and renumbering as follows:

31.8 A student may not play or practice on a non-school volleyball team while a member of the school team.

31.8 31.9 A student may accept awards only in WVSSAC sanctioned events during the season of that sport. These awards must be consistent with the items mentioned in the Awards Rule. Students may accept only this same type of award in non-sanctioned events outside the sport season.

**Rationale:**

The inclusion of the Non-participation Rule under the specific sport is consistent with other team sport regulations.

**JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS**

31.9The above will apply for junior high schools with the following adaptations:

- (a) Junior high teams will be permitted 16 matches.
- (b) Organized team practice will begin on Monday of Week 8 and the first contest may be played on Wednesday of Week 10.
- (c) Junior high season will be completed by Saturday of Week 18.
- (d) Junior high teams are permitted one (1) scrimmage under the same conditions as a high school.
- (e) Junior high teams are not permitted to play in an alumni game.

**Proposal 1**

- a. If the number of administrative districts is raised from five to eight, the amount of annual student scholarships of \$1,000 each would increase from \$5,000 to \$8,000.
- b. If the number of administrative districts is raised from five to eight, three additional representatives would need to be added to each of the fourteen Sport Coaches' Committees. Currently, each representative's expenses is \$50.00 annually. The increase of 42 more representatives would be an additional expense of \$2,100.00.
- c. If the number of administrative districts is increased, the number of Board of Appeals members would increase from five to eight. There would be an increase of \$900 in personal services due to a \$300 honorarium received by each member.
- d. The current expense for each board member is \$3,350 annually. The additional three members would result in an increase expense of \$10,050.
