



**The proposed rule essentially repeals former CSR §81-1-1 et seq., and covers policy and procedure, not in other State Police legislative rules or in the W. Va. Code, governing the administration of the West Virginia State Police.**

## **Circumstances Requiring Repeal of Rule**

The following circumstances led to the proposed amendments to former CSR §81-1-1 et seq.:

1.) The current rule contains over thirteen pages of language covered in the West Virginia Code at §§15-2-2, 3, 4, 5, 9, 10, 12, 13, 18, 20, 21, 25 and in other legislative rules of the State Police. Therefore, it is unnecessary to have similar provisions in this legislative rule. To eliminate such extensive duplicity, the proposed rule seeks to repeal the former rule (for the foregoing reasons) and make the following amendments to the remainder of the rule:

(a) The legislature changed the name of the agency from the "Division of Public Safety" to the "West Virginia State Police." The proposed rule reflects this change.

(b) The current rule contains the "Rules of Conduct," which lists the "activities or conduct prohibited to Department members." The "Rules of Conduct" are not grouped according to the severity of the offenses and their respective discipline. This is contrary to the progressive discipline system contained in CSR §81-10-1 et seq. The proposed rule seeks to repeal the "Rules of Conduct" leaving prohibited activities and their respective discipline at the detailed CSR §81-10-1 et seq.

(c) The transfer language in the current rule contains an inordinate amount unnecessary detail. The proposed rule, without reducing the transfer power of the department, simplifies and condenses the transfer language.

(d) The current rule discusses the creation of a "Promotion Evaluation Board." However, promotions are fully discussed at CSR §81-3-1 et seq. Therefore, the proposed rule seeks to repeal this language, leaving promotional language primarily at CSR §81-3-1.

Each member shall To ensure that his General Orders Manual and Operational Policy and Procedure Manual contain all current general orders and the continued efficient operation of the organization, a department memorandum or teletype issued by authority of the Superintendent may temporarily amend or rescind any operational policies and procedures policy or procedure until a revised draft is issued. Department memoranda shall be issued at the direction of the Superintendent.~~

To ensure the continued efficient operation of the organization, a department memorandum or teletype issued The enlistment, permanent transfer, promotion, demotion, suspension or discharge of members of the West Virginia State Police shall be effected by authority of the Superintendent may temporarily amend or rescind any general department special order or operational policy or procedure until a revised draft is issued. Department memoranda special orders shall be issued by at the direction of the Superintendent.~~

~~2.8. The enlistment, permanent transfer, promotion, demotion, suspension or discharge of members of the Department of Public Safety shall be effected by department special order. Department special orders shall be issued by the direction of the Superintendent.~~

~~Information to members may be disseminated either by department memorandum or department notice.~~

~~2.9. Transfers All members of the West Virginia State Police shall adhere to all policies, procedures, and rules governing the operation of the department. See Section 7 of these rules Failure to adhere to any specified policy, procedure, or rule may be punishable by counseling, reprimand, demotion, suspension with pay, suspension without pay or discharge.~~

~~2.10. Information to members may be disseminated either by department memorandum or department notice.~~

~~2.11. All members of the Department of Public Safety shall adhere to all policies, procedures, rules and regulations governing the operation of the Department. Failure to adhere to any specified policy, procedure, rule or regulation may be~~

~~punishable by reprimand, demotion, suspension with pay, suspension without pay or discharge. §81-1-3. Organizational Structure And Duties.~~

~~3.1. This section relates to West Virginia Code sections two, three and four, article two, chapter fifteen.~~

~~3.2. The Superintendent shall serve as the executive and administrative head of the Department of Public Safety. The Superintendent shall hold the rank of Colonel and shall be entitled to all rights, benefits and privileges of regularly enlisted members.~~

~~3.3. The Superintendent shall appoint from the enlisted membership of the Department of Public Safety a Deputy Superintendent who shall hold the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and be next in authority to the Superintendent.~~

~~3.4. The term Executive Office shall encompass the following: (1) Superintendent; (2) Deputy Superintendent; (3) Chief of Staff Services; (4) Chief of Field Operations; (5) Inspector; and (6) such other offices as the Superintendent deems necessary.~~

~~3.5. The Deputy Superintendent shall serve as the principal coordinator of department field operations and staff services functions. The Deputy Superintendent shall perform other duties as may be assigned by the Superintendent.~~

~~3.6. If the Superintendent is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, due to illness, disease, injury or any other cause or is absent from the geographical boundaries of West Virginia, the order of succession is as follows:~~

~~(a) Deputy Superintendent;~~

~~(b) The senior member of the Executive Office if the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent are absent.~~

~~Whenever the Deputy Superintendent or the senior member succeeds to the Office of the Superintendent he shall exercise all the powers, functions, duties and responsibilities of the Superintendent.~~

~~3.7. The Superintendent shall appoint from the enlisted membership of the Department the number of officers and members~~

~~necessary to operate and maintain the Executive Office.~~

~~3.8. The Chief of Staff Services shall be responsible to the Superintendent for the coordination of all staff services functions and the correlation of activities and duties of staff services with those of field operations. The Chief of Staff Services shall perform other duties as assigned by the Superintendent and/or Deputy Superintendent.~~

~~3.9. The Chief of Field Operations shall be responsible to the Superintendent for the planning, conducting and monitoring of all field operations and the correlation of activities and duties of field operations with those of staff services. The Chief of Field Operations shall perform other duties as assigned by the Superintendent and/or the Deputy Superintendent.~~

~~3.10. The Inspector shall be responsible to the Superintendent for ensuring that all members and civilian employees adhere to all policy and procedure governing the operation of the Department; the inspection of all Department owned, leased, rented or maintained structures; and, the inspection of all departmental records and reports. The Inspector shall serve as the Superintendent's principal point of contact regarding complaints filed against Department members or civilian employees. The Inspector shall submit to the Superintendent recommendations regarding the disposition of complaints. The Inspector shall perform other duties as assigned by the Superintendent.~~

~~3.11. The Department of Public Safety shall consist of the number of companies, districts and detachments as are required for the proper administration of the Department. Each company, district or detachment shall be composed of the number of officers and members the Superintendent deems necessary for the efficient operation of the Department.~~

~~3.12. Each Company Headquarters Staff shall consist of the Company Commander; Company Executive Officer; Company Logistics Officer; and other members and civilian employees the Superintendent deems necessary.~~

~~3.13. Each Company Commander shall be responsible for the planning, conducting and monitoring of all field operations occurring within his company. Each Company Commander shall be responsible for the correlation of the activities and duties of members and civilian employees assigned to his command with those of staff services.~~

~~3.14. Each Company Executive Officer shall perform duties assigned by his Company Commander. In the absence of the Company Commander, the Company Executive Officer shall serve as the Acting Company Commander and exercise all the powers, functions, duties and responsibilities of the Company Commander.~~

~~3.15. Each Company Logistics Officer shall perform duties assigned by his Company Commander. In the absence of the Company Commander and the Company Executive Officer, the Company Logistics Officer shall serve as the Acting Company Commander and shall exercise all the powers, functions, duties and responsibilities of the Company Commander.~~

~~3.16. Each District Headquarters Staff shall consist of the District Commander and other members and civilian employees the Superintendent deems necessary.~~

~~3.17. Each District Commander shall be responsible for the planning, conducting and monitoring of all field operations occurring within his district. Each District Commander shall be responsible for the correlation of the activities and duties of members and civilian employees assigned to his command with those of staff services. Each District Commander shall perform duties as assigned by his Company Commander.~~

~~3.18. Each Detachment Headquarters Staff shall consist of the Detachment Commander and other members and civilian employees the Superintendent deems necessary.~~

~~3.19. Each Detachment Commander shall be responsible for the planning, conducting and monitoring of all field operations occurring within his detachments area of operations. Each Detachment Commander shall be responsible for the correlation of the activities and duties of members and civilian employees assigned to his command with those of staff services. Each Detachment Commander shall perform duties assigned by his District Commander.~~

~~3.20. The Superintendent shall appoint, from the enlisted members of the Department, the number of officers and members he deems necessary to operate and maintain a scientific laboratory; keep records relating to crimes and criminals; coordinate traffic safety activities; maintain a system of supplies and accounting; and, perform other necessary services.~~

~~§81-1-4. Rank Structure.~~

~~4.1. This section relates to West Virginia Code sections four and ten, article two, chapter fifteen.~~

~~4.2. The rank structure within the membership of the Department of Public Safety shall be as follows: Colonel; Lieutenant Colonel; Major; Captain; Lieutenant; Master Sergeant; First Sergeant; Sergeant; Corporal; Trooper First Class; and Trooper.~~

~~4.3. The Superintendent may appoint from the membership of the department eleven (11) principal supervisors who shall receive the compensation and hold the temporary rank of Lieutenant Colonel, Major or Captain at the will and pleasure of the Superintendent. Such appointments shall be exempt from any merit standards established by the Promotion Evaluation Board. Any person appointed to a temporary rank shall retain his permanent rank and shall remain eligible for promotion if his permanent rank is below that of Captain. Upon termination of his temporary appointment, the member shall be entitled to the full rights and privileges of his permanent rank and shall remain eligible for subsequent appointment to a temporary rank.~~

~~4.4. The appropriate insignia shall be as follows: Colonel -- Silver Eagle; Lieutenant Colonel -- Silver Oak Leaf; Major -- Gold Oak Leaf; Captain -- Two Silver Shoulder Bars; Lieutenant -- One Silver Shoulder Bar and Noncommissioned Officers -- Black Chevrons of the Appropriate Rank~~

~~4.5. All members of the Department shall, while in uniform, wear the insignia appropriate to his rank.~~

~~shall be forthwith brought before the proper tribunal for examination and trial in the county where the offense for which any such arrest has been made was committed;~~

~~(b) Serve criminal process issued by any court or magistrate anywhere within this State; and~~

~~(c) Cooperate with local authorities in detecting crime and apprehending any person or persons engaged in or suspected of the commission of any crime, misdemeanor or offense against the law of this State or of the United States or of any ordinance of any municipality in this State; and to take affidavits in connection with any application to the Department of Highways, Department of Motor Vehicles, and Department of Public Safety of West Virginia for any license, permit or certificate that may be lawfully issued by these departments of state government.~~

~~5.3. Members of the Department of Public Safety are created forest patrolmen and game and fish wardens throughout the state to do and perform any duties and exercise any powers of such officers.~~

~~5.4. Members of the Department of Public Safety shall at any time be subject to the call of the West Virginia Alcohol Beverage Control Commissioner to aid in apprehending any persons violating any of the provisions of chapter sixty of the Code of West Virginia.~~

~~5.5. Members of the Department of Public Safety shall be empowered to serve and execute warrants for the arrest of any person and warrants for the search of any premises issued by any properly constituted authority, and shall exercise all of the powers conferred by law upon a sheriff except no member shall serve civil process or exercise any of the powers of such officer in civil matters.~~

~~5.6. Any member of the Department of Public Safety knowing or having reason to believe that anyone has violated the law may make complaint in writing before any court or officer having jurisdiction and procure a warrant for such offender, execute the same and bring such person before the proper tribunal having jurisdiction.~~

~~5.7. Members of the Department of Public Safety may execute any summons or process issued by any tribunal having jurisdiction requiring the attendance of any person as a witness before such tribunal and make return thereon as provided by law and any return by a member showing the manner~~

~~of executing such warrant or process shall have the same force and effect as if made by a sheriff.~~

~~5.8. Each member of the Department of Public Safety, when called by the sheriff of any county or when the Governor by proclamation so directs, shall have full power and authority within such county, or within the territory defined by the Governor, to direct and command absolutely the assistance of any sheriff, deputy sheriff, chief of police, policeman, game and fish warden and peace officer of the state, or of any county or municipality therein, or of any able-bodied citizen of the United States, to assist and aid in accomplishing the purposes expressed in article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~5.9. The Superintendent may assign members to perform police duties on any turnpike or toll road, or any section thereof, operated by the West Virginia Turnpike Commission.~~

#### ~~§81-1-6. Limitations Upon Members.~~

~~6.1. This section relates to West Virginia Code sections five, twelve, thirteen and eighteen, article two, chapter fifteen.~~

~~6.2. Each member of the Department, except the Superintendent, shall execute before entering upon the discharge of his duties a bond with security in the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) payable to the state of West Virginia, conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties. Such bond shall be approved as to form by the Attorney General and to sufficiency by the Governor.~~

~~6.3. No member of the Department of Public Safety shall serve civil process.~~

~~6.4. No member of the Department of Public Safety shall:~~

~~(a) In any way interfere with the rights or property of any person except for the prevention of crime;~~

~~(b) In any way become active or take part in any political contest or at any time participate in any political party caucus, committee, primary, assembly or convention, or in any general or special election, except to cast his ballot. (See Sections 10.23, 10.24 and 10.25 of these rules for specific prohibitions).~~

~~(c) Be detailed or ordered to duty at or near any voting~~

~~precinct (polling place) where any election or convention is held on the day of such election or convention; nor shall any member thereof remain in, about, or near such voting precinct (polling place) or place of convention, except to cast his vote; (See Sections 10.23, 10.24 and 10.25 of these rules for specific prohibitions).~~

~~(d) Act as an election official (See Sections 10.23, 10.24 and 10.25 of these rules for specific prohibitions); or~~

~~(e) In any labor trouble or dispute between employer and employee, aid or assist either party thereto, but shall in such cases see that the statutes and laws of this State are enforced in a legal way and manner.~~

~~6.5. No officer or member of the Department of Public Safety shall hire himself to any person, firm or corporation to guard his private property or demand or receive from any person, firm or corporation any money or other thing of value as a consideration for the performance of, or the failure to perform, his duties under the regulations of the Superintendent and the provisions of article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~6.6. A retired member of the Department of Public Safety shall not, while in retirement status, act under authority of law and specifically those relating to the Department or exercise any of the powers conferred upon active members.~~

#### ~~§81-1-7. Transfer.~~

~~7.13.1. This section relates to West Virginia Code section twenty, article two, chapter fifteen.~~

~~7.23.2. Definitions. -- For purposes of this section:~~

~~(a) TransferIntercompany means assignment from one (1) detachment to another detachment a different company.~~

~~(b) PermanentIntracompany means more than sixty (60) dayswithin the member's company.~~

~~(c) TemporaryInvoluntary transfer means sixty (60) a transfer that is not at the request or less than sixty (60) dayswith the consent of the member.~~

~~(d) Intracompany means within the member's companyOperational needs - shall encompass; consideration of officer safety, the department's ability to provide services.~~

the member's performance and ability, supervisory evaluation of member's suitability, change in mission or within Department Headquarters mission priority, department resources and budget management, and/or other reasonable factors.

(e) Intercompany Permanent means to a different company, into or out of Department Headquarters more than sixty (60) days.

When any member of the Department is to be permanently transferred, the member shall be notified in writing of the proposed transfer at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the effective date of such transfer (g) Transfer means assignment from one (1) field operation station to another field operation station.

The Superintendent shall not be required to give notice if the transfer is (h) Voluntary transfer means a transfer at the request of or is waived by with the consent of the member who is to be transferred.

3.3. To meet operational needs, when any member of the department is to be involuntarily and permanently transferred, the member shall be notified in writing of the proposed transfer at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the effective date of such transfer. The Superintendent shall not be required to give notice if:

(a) the transfer is voluntary; or

(b) the result of a promotion to a supervisory rank; or

(c) the result of a member's request for appointment to a support specialist position; or

(d) at the request of or is waived by the member who is to be transferred.

The day the notice is given shall not be counted in the fifteen (15) days' notice requirement. Oral notification shall suffice to temporarily transfer a member inter or intracompany; oral notification shall be confirmed in writing. The Superintendent may transfer members to meet the operational needs of the Department. A transfer may not be made as a disciplinary measure. Company commanders are authorized to

initiate intracompany temporary transfers.

7.43.4. A department special order shall be used to effect a permanent transfer. Department special orders shall be issued byat the direction of the Superintendent.

If the member transferred owns and resides in a mobile home, the Department shall pay reasonable and necessary transportation expenses actually incurred in moving such mobile home: Provided, That such expenses do not exceed the amount which would have been paid for moving an equivalent amount of household furniture and effects had the member not owned and resided in a mobile home. The provisions of this subsection~~

shall apply if the transfer is requested by the member.

7-103.9. If a transfer for a period in excess of sixty (60) calendar days necessitates the relocation of the involved member's family, the member shall be entitled to a relocation allowance of three hundred dollars (\$300) which shall be paid by the Department. When a member relocates from state owned or leased property to state owned or leased property such payment shall not be made.

7-113.11. Members of the Department shall not be restricted from residing in a county other than that in which they are stationed except that the Superintendent may promulgate by appropriate written regulation to be applied uniformly throughout the Department a restriction as to either the number of miles distant from his station which a member may reside or the time necessary under ordinary traffic conditions for a member to travel between his residence and station.

~~10.2. Using any weapon which has not been authorized for use. Subsection (b), section ten, article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~10.3. Using any law-enforcement equipment which has not been authorized for use. Subsection (b), section ten, article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~10.4. Alter or change any issued equipment without proper authority.~~

~~10.5. Serving civil process. Subdivision (2), subsection (b), section twelve, article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~10.6. Aiding or assisting either party in any labor trouble or dispute between employer and employee except for the enforcement in a legal way and manner, the statutes and laws of West Virginia. Section thirteen, article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~——10.16. Willful failure to perform duties. --- The omission is willful when the failure is with full knowledge of the duty and an intention not to perform it.~~

~~——10.17. Malingering. --- Malingering means feigning illness, physical disability, mental lapse or derangement, or intentionally inflicting self-injury for the purpose of avoiding work, duty or service.~~

Accepting gratuities. --- Members will not solicit, demand or receive or agree to receive any money, thing of value or gratuity from any person, partnership, firm or corporation as a consideration for the performance of or the failure to perform his duties under provisions of law, Department regulations, memoranda, policies and/or procedures. Section eighteen, article two, chapter fifteen of the West Virginia Code.~~

~~——10.19. No member shall convert property of the State of West Virginia through a negligent or willful act. Convert means:~~

~~——(a) To sell or otherwise dispose of;~~

~~——(c) To suffer to be lost, damaged, destroyed, sold or wrongfully disposed of.~~

~~(1) A deputy sheriff used offensive language in the presence of members of an ambulance service wholly without justification; unnecessarily threatened to impose criminal penalties upon the driver of the ambulance; and, the deputy used excessive physical force and personal abuse in the arrest of an individual initially stopped for an alleged traffic violation. (Deputy dismissed)~~

~~(2) Deputy sheriff: Kicked and knocked down a handcuffed subject; hit an individual with a slap across the side of the face and the head. (Deputy dismissed)~~
