The rule incorporates by reference the ambient air quality standards in West Virginia for sulfur oxides, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, ozone, nitrogen dioxide and lead, equivalent to the national primary and secondary ambient air quality standards (NAAQS) established under §109 of the Clean Air Act, and promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 50. National primary ambient air quality standards define levels of air quality which the Administrator of the U.S. EPA judges are necessary, with an adequate margin of safety, to protect the public health. National secondary ambient air quality standards define levels of air quality which the Administrator of the U.S. EPA judges necessary to protect the public welfare from any known or anticipated adverse effects of a pollutant.

The rule also incorporates by reference the ambient air monitoring reference methods and equivalent methods promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 53. These reference methods are used to demonstrate attainment (or non-attainment) of the NAAQS.

The standards and methods under 40 CFR Parts 50 and 53 are subject to revision, and additional primary and secondary standards may be promulgated as the Administrator of the U.S. EPA deems necessary to protect the public health and welfare.

SUMMARIZE IN A CLEAR AND CONCISE MANNER CONTENTS OF CHANGES IN RULE AND STATEMENT OF CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRING THE RULE.

In accordance with §109 of the Clean Air Act (CAA), U.S. EPA has promulgated air quality criteria and NAAQS for sulfur oxides, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, ozone, nitrogen dioxide and lead. 45CSR8 will meet the requirements for State Implementation Plans under §110 of the CAA through the NAAQS for sulfur oxides, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, ozone, nitrogen dioxide and lead incorporated by reference in this rule.

Based on its review of the air quality criteria and the national ambient air quality standards for particulate matter, EPA has revised the standard for fine particles to provide requisite protection of public health, and to made corresponding revisions to the data handling conventions for particulate matter and to the ambient air monitoring, reporting, and network design requirements.

With regard to primary standards for fine particles (PM2.5), the EPA is revising the annual PM2.5 standard by lowering the level from 15.0 to 12.0 micrograms per cubic meter (g/m3) so as to provide increased protection against health effects associated with long and short-term exposures such as premature mortality, increased hospital admissions and emergency department visits, and development of chronic respiratory disease. The final rule retains the 24-hour PM2.5 standard at a level of 35 g/m3.

45CSR8 incorporates by reference these revised standards. In accordance with §110(a)(2) (H) of the CAA, the DAQ

AMBIENT AIR QUALITY STANDARDS

§45-8-1. General.

1.1. Scope. -- This rule establishes and adopts ambient air quality standards in West Virginia for sulfur oxides, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, ozone, nitrogen dioxide and lead, equivalent to the national primary and secondary ambient air quality standards established under Section 109 of the Clean Air Act, and promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 50. National primary ambient air quality standards define levels of air quality which the Administrator judges are necessary, with an adequate margin of safety, to protect the public health. National secondary ambient air quality standards define levels of air quality which the Administrator judges necessary to protect the public welfare from any known or anticipated adverse effects of a pollutant. This rule also establishes and adopts ambient air monitoring reference methods and equivalent methods promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 53. The Secretary hereby adopts these standards and methods by reference. The Secretary also adopts the appendices to these standards and methods. These standards and methods are subject to revision, and additional primary and secondary standards may be promulgated as the Administrator deems necessary to protect the public health and welfare.

1.2. Authority. -- W.Va. Code §22-5-4.

1.3. Filing Date. -- ~~May 1, 2012.~~

1.4. Effective Date. -- ~~June 1, 2012.~~

1.5. Incorporation by Reference. -- Federal Counterpart Regulation. The Secretary has determined that a federal counterpart regulation exists, and in accordance with the Secretary's recommendation this rule incorporates by reference 40 CFR Part 50, "National Primary and Secondary Ambient Air Quality Standards," and 40 CFR Part 53, "Ambient Air Monitoring Reference and Equivalent Methods, effective ~~June 1, 2011~~ June 1, 2013."

1.6. Former Rules. -- This legislative rule amends 45CSR8 - "Ambient Air Quality Standards" which was filed on ~~June 16, 2011~~ May 1, 2012 and became effective on ~~June 16, 2011~~ June 1, 2012.

§45-8-2. Definitions.

2.1. "Administrator" means the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency or

his or her authorized representative.

2.2. "Clean Air Act" or "CAA" means the federal Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §7401 et seq.

2.3. "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection or such other person to whom the Secretary has delegated authority or duties pursuant to W.Va. Code §§22-1-6 or 22-1-8.

2.4. Other words and phrases used in this rule, unless otherwise indicated, shall have the meaning ascribed to them in 40 CFR §50.1. Words and phrases not defined therein shall have the meaning given to them in the federal Clean Air Act.

§45-8-3. Adoption of Standards.

3.1. The Secretary hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the national primary and secondary ambient air quality standards promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 50, effective ~~June 1, 2011~~ June 1, 2013. These standards are adopted for the purpose of establishing ambient air quality standards in West Virginia that are equivalent to those established under Section 109 of the Clean Air Act, as amended.

3.2. The Secretary hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the ambient air monitoring reference methods and equivalent methods promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR Part 53, effective ~~June 1, 2011~~ June 1, 2013. These standards are adopted for the purpose of establishing ambient air monitoring reference methods and equivalent methods in West Virginia.

§45-8-4. Inconsistency Between Rules.

4.1. In the event of any inconsistency between this rule and any other rule of the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection, the inconsistency shall be resolved by the determination of the Secretary and the determination shall be based upon the application of the more stringent provision, term, condition, method, or rule.
