ABSTRACT

The proposed rule amends a current legislative rule. Under current rule, the transaction fee continues in effect until December 31, 2003. The proposed rule would extend the effect of the fee until December 31, 2008.

AUTHORITY

Statutory authority: W.Va. Code, §12-3-10c, which provides, in part, as follows:

(a) In order to promote and enhance the use of the state purchasing card program established by the provisions of section ten-a of this article and in order to maintain and develop the fiscal operations and accounting systems of the state, the auditor and the treasurer may assess joint transaction fees for all financial documents that will be

processed on the central accounting system. Such transaction fees shall be prescribed by legislative rule proposed in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code and may include the following...
