SUBJECT: RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING HOUSEKEEPING PRACTICES IN UNDERGROUND MINES AND SURFACE AREAS OF UNDERGROUND MINES

Section 1. General 1.1 Scope - same

1.01 Authority - These rules and regulations are issued under authority of Section <sup>4</sup> 4, Article <sup>6</sup> 2A, Chapter <sup>22</sup> 22 of the Code. *Felins D. C.*

1.02 Effective Date - These rules and regulations were promulgated on the 25th day of May, 1984, and become effective on the 1st day of July, 1984.

1.03 Effect of Regulations - These rules and regulations shall have the effect of law and violations shall be deemed a violation of law and so cited with the same effect as law. All provisions of Article <sup>1A</sup> 1, Chapter <sup>22A</sup> 22A of the Code relative to enforcement are applicable to the enforcement of these rules and regulations.

Section 2. Definitions

2.01 All terms used in these rules and regulations, not defined herein, shall have the meanings set forth in Section <sup>1</sup> 1, Article <sup>1A</sup> 1, Chapter <sup>22A</sup> 22A of the Code.

Section 3. Housekeeping Practices

3.01 Good housekeeping shall be practiced in all areas of underground mines, and in and around mine buildings and yards. Such practices shall include cleanliness, orderly storage of materials, and the removal of possible sources of injury, such as stumbling hazards, protruding nails, and broken glass.
