I urge the Board to continue to allow individual schools to select courses based on student need. Our school, for instance, has only one business teacher and offers business law, accounting, personal finance, and business computers. Under the proposed guidelines, students at Scott High would lose the ability to take two very important courses. Business Computers teaches students typing and Microsoft Office skills that they would not otherwise have. In addition, students benefit greatly from access to the Personal Finance course. It prepares them for a financially secure future.
