State Fire Marshal "Fees for Services"

SUMMARY:

This rule repeals title 87 Series 5 previously authorized by the State Fire Commission in accordance with WV State Code 29-3-12b, 1989.

Changes in the State Code removes the fees charged from statute and authorizes the State Fire Marshal to establish a fee schedule by rules by State Code 29-3-12b 2002.

CIRCUMSTANCES:

To comply with recently passed legislation that authorizes the Fire Marshal to set a fee schedule by rules and which will place the operations of the State Fire Marshal's operation primarily under "Appropriated Special Revenues" beginning July 1, 2004.

This rule will direct revenue beginning July 1, 2004 to the Special Revenue Fund. Current Statutory requirement, under State Code 29-3 will be funded from the Special Revenue Fund.
