The following regulations pertaining to qualifications, training, examination, and registration of Instructors in Barbering and Beauty Culture were adopted at a called meeting of the State Committee of Barbers and Beauticians in Charleston, July 28, 1969.

The two, new, regulations will supplement the existing "General Regulations," and the regulations pertaining to the renewal of regular instructors certificate.

The first regulation is to be added as paragraph six (6) under the existing "General Regulations," which will read as follows:

"An applicant, in order to renew a certificate of registration as an instructor, must have been employed full-time for at least three consecutive months within the calendar year as an instructor in an approved school of barbering or beauty culture. In the event an applicant has not been so employed, such applicant shall submit to an examination before the committee and complete a six-months 'in-service' training program in a state approved barber or beauty college."

Under "Renewal of Instructors Certificate of Registration," the second regulation will amend this section by the addition of a sub-section, number three (3), which will read as follows:

"Every person now registered as a regular instructor on the effective date of this regulation, who has not been employed in an approved school of barbering or beauty culture for at least three (3) consecutive months within the calendar year, shall in order to renew the certificate of registration, submit to an examination before the committee and complete a six-months 'in-service' training program in a state approved barber or beauty college."

In addition to the above regulations, the committee is eliminating the licensing of any persons as a "Limited Instructor," as provided for in the present "General Rules and Regulations." Therefore, the section entitled "Limited Instructor," together with all of the rules and regulations applicable thereto, are to be deleted from said rules and regulations.
