



Subject: Emergency Rules and Regulations - Water Pollution in the
Pocatalico River and its Effect on the Peace, Health,
Safety and Welfare of the Residents of Sissonville.

SPECIAL RULE

Section 1. General

1.01. Scope.--Rules and Regulations - Water pollution in the Pocatalico River and its effect on the peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of Sissonville.

1.02. Authority.--These rules and regulations are issued under authority of West Virginia Code 29A-3-5 and Code 16-1-3.

1.03. Effective Date.--These rules and regulations are to become effective immediately.

1.04. Filing Date.--These rules and regulations were filed in the office of the Secretary of State, June 26, 1967.

1.05. Certification.--These rules and regulations were certified authentic by the Secretary of State by certification number _____.

Section 2. Emergency Rules and Regulations - Water Pollution in the Pocatalico River and its Effect on the Peace, Health, Safety and Welfare of the Residents of Sissonville.--

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the State Board of Health that water source serving the Community of Sissonville is being contaminated and rendered unfit for use through the acts of certain persons, firms and corporations located in Roane County, West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the source of said pollution emanates from oil or other drilling operations in Roane County, located along the

Pocatalico River and its tributaries, which watershed serves the Community of Sissonville; and

WHEREAS, the pollution aforesaid consists of brines and other industrial wastes, which brines contain chlorides which, if present in public water systems in sufficient amounts, are detrimental to health; and

WHEREAS, the nature of brines is such that they are not cleansed or neutralized by time or passage through distance or water, but rather retain their dangerous potentialities, which potentialities are cumulative in nature and are not susceptible to treatment by existing equipment of the local water suppliers; and

WHEREAS, the Community of Sissonville is without an adequate alternate supply of water to serve the residents thereof; it is

THEREFORE determined that a condition exists wherein the peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of Sissonville are imperiled and must be immediately preserved. The West Virginia Board of Health, meeting in Special Session, does hereby make and promulgate the following Emergency Rules, pursuant to the authority contained in Code 29A-3-5 and Code 16-1-3, such rules to take effect immediately and remain in effect until the situation has been remedied, or for 90 days, whichever comes first:

1. The discharge or release of brines or other industrial wastes into the waters of the Pocatalico River or its tributaries, either directly or indirectly, is prohibited.
2. The health officials of the counties of Roane and Kanawha are directed to immediately commence investigation and enforcement of this rule.

Subject: Rules Governing the Temporary Licensing of Foreign Medical School Graduates to Practice Medicine and Surgery in Prescribed Areas in West Virginia.

Section 1. General

1.01. Scope.--These regulations establish general rules for the licensing of Foreign Medical School Graduates in West Virginia.

1.02. Authority.--These regulations are issued under authority of West Virginia Code, Chapter 16, Article 3, Section 4.

1.03. Effective Date.--These regulations were adopted on October 28, 1963, to become effective immediately.

1.04. Filing Date.--These regulations were filed in the Office of the Secretary of State, October 29, 1963.

1.05. Certification.--These regulations were certified authentic by the Secretary of State, by certification number 17.

Section 2. Rules Governing the Temporary Licensing of Foreign Medical School Graduates in West Virginia

2.01. Right to Practice.--Graduates of foreign medical schools may obtain temporary licenses to practice medicine and surgery in hospitals operated by the State of West Virginia and in privately-operated, approved hospitals in West Virginia by special permission from the Medical Licensing Board.

2.02. Definition.--The term "approved hospital" shall be interpreted to mean a hospital approved by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals as meeting unconditionally its minimum requirements for general standardization.

2.03. Requirements.--

- (a) Each application shall be accompanied by satisfactory evidence of premedical and medical education, a small photograph of applicant (approximately 3 in. by 3 in.), and any other evidence available covering training and experience. A minimum of eighteen years of education is required.
- (b) All applicants, with the exception of those expecting to locate in State-operated hospitals, or those licensed in some other State in the United States, shall submit evidence of having passed the examination given by the Educational Council for Foreign Medical School Graduates.
- (c) Applicants are required to appear before the Medical Licensing Board for approval. Meetings are held in January, April, July, and October. Physicians arriving in West Virginia between sessions of the Board shall contact the Secretary of the Board concerning approval until the next regular meeting.
- (d) A fee of \$25.00 is required for the examination and evaluation of credentials and the issuance of a temporary license.
- (e) Applicants shall sign a contract agreeing to abide by the regulations of the Medical Licensing Board before assuming any duties.

2.04. Issuance of Temporary Licenses.--

(a) Temporary licenses may be issued on a yearly basis not to exceed four years. In the event an applicant is participating in a training program approved by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of the American Medical Association, completion thereof may be allowed at the discretion of the Board.

(b) Written approval shall be obtained for each year of practice, and physicians shall notify the Board upon termination of services.

2.05. Permanent Licenses. Foreign medical school graduates shall apply for permanent licensure in West Virginia as soon as eligible. Failure to do so will cause cancellation of the temporary license granted by the Board.

Section 2. Special Rules - West Virginia Nursing Home Licensing Board.--

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the West Virginia Nursing Home Licensing Board that it is currently without duly enacted rules and regulations under which it may issue licenses to nursing homes operating within the State of West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by a quorum of the members present that it is of extreme urgency that nursing home licenses be immediately issued, in order that nursing homes operating within the State shall not be in violation of West Virginia laws, due to their lack of properly issued nursing home licenses; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing reason, nursing homes within the State cannot receive State and Federal welfare payments without having been issued a nursing home license from the State of West Virginia, the West

Virginia Nursing Home Licensing Board, and for other reasons of immediate concern and urgency;

AND WHEREAS, the West Virginia Nursing Home Licensing Board declares that an emergency condition exists because of such absence of existing rules and regulations under which it may properly issue nursing home licenses; and


WHEREAS, the aforesaid Nursing Home Licensing Board further finds that this emergency condition threatens the public peace, health, safety and welfare;

NOW THEREFORE, because of this emergency condition the West Virginia Nursing Home Licensing Board, pursuant to Chapter 29-A, Article 3, Section 5 of the West Virginia Code, as amended, adopts for the statutory period of 90 days, or for whatever shorter term is found necessary, the rules and regulations of the West Virginia Department of Health, Bureau of Hospitals and Medical Facilities, titled "Regulations, Standards and Licensing Law for Nursing Homes", now on file in the Secretary of State's Office, so far as those rules and regulations are not inconsistent with Chapter 16, Article 5C of the West Virginia Code, as amended. These emergency rules and regulations are to take immediate effect upon this, the 6th day of July, 1967.







- (d) Birth Certificate - Each application must be accompanied by a certified copy of applicant's birth certificate or other satisfactory documentary evidence of citizenship in the United States.

3.02. Submission of Application.--All applications must be in the office of the Secretary of the Medical Licensing Board of West Virginia, State Office Building, 1800 Washington Street, Charleston, West Virginia, 25305, sixty days prior to the examination. The filing of an application does not entitle an applicant to practice. The only legal authority for practicing is a certificate from the Medical Licensing Board.

3.03. Documents.--All documents submitted as evidence of eligibility for licensure must be properly signed and under the seal of the issuing authority. This evidence becomes the property of the State as a part of the permanent records of the Medical Licensing Board and will not be returned.

3.04. Fee.--A check or money order of \$25.00, covering \$20.00 for examination and \$5.00 for a certificate of licensure must accompany each application. The examination fee will not be returned if a certificate is refused, but applicant is entitled to reexamination without further cost at either the first or second succeeding examination conducted by the Board. One such examination exhausts this privilege under the original application.

3.05. Rules of Examination.--

- (a) Examination manuscripts are furnished by the Board.
- (b) After finishing each section, write your name and number on front cover.
- (c) One and one-quarter hours are allowed for each section.
- (d) Applicants are not permitted to leave the hall during the examination.
- (e) Upon finishing a section, applicants will at once hand in their manuscripts to the examiner and retire from the room.
- (f) A general average of 75 per cent entitles applicant to licensure provided he does not fall below 65 per cent in any branch.


