

2.02 Section 5, Article 2, Chapter 19 of the Code of West Virginia provides that the Commissioner of Agriculture shall establish and publish a schedule of charges for the inspecting and grading of agricultural products at public markets, concentration points, packing, grading and processing plants and other places where agricultural products are assembled for distribution.

2.03 By virtue of the authority vested in me as Commissioner of Agriculture, I, J. T. Johnson, do hereby prescribe, promulgate and declare in force and effect, the following rules and regulations regarding rates for inspection and grading of said grain:

(a) GRAIN INSPECTIONS:

Truck Lot	\$4.00 - Plus .01¢ per bushel.
Car Lot	\$4.00 - Plus .01¢ per bushel.
Bin	\$4.00 - Plus .01¢ per bushel.
Warehouse	\$2.00 Per thousand bushel - Plus .01¢ per bushel.
Bag Lots	\$2.00 Per thousand bushel - Minimum \$4.00.

(b) SUBMITTED SAMPLE INSPECTIONS:

All submitted samples	\$3.00 Per sample.
Single factor determination	\$2.00 Per sample.

Subject: Grain Inspection Department Fees and Charges

Section 1 -GENERAL

1.01 Scope. These regulations establish general operating rules and procedures in the Grain Inspection Department.

1.02 Authority. These regulations are issued under authority of Chapter 19, Article 2, Section 5, Code of West Virginia.

1.03 Effective Date. These regulations are promulgated and become effective on February 1, 1959.

Section 2 -DECLARATION OF POLICY.
