Subject: FRUITS AND VEGETABLES
Schedule of Charges for Inspection Services

In pursuant to Chapter 19, Article 2, Section 5, Code of West Virginia, the West Virginia Department of Agriculture will, upon request, render inspection services to the producers of fruits, vegetables, eggs and other agricultural products produced, sold, traded, exchanged, transported or otherwise moved in the trade channels of West Virginia.

For the purpose of defraying the cost of inspection, the following schedule of charges shall prevail:

For one product.

Quality and condition when the quantity is more than one-half, but not more than a full car or truck lot-----	\$ 12.00
When not more than one-half car or truck lot-----	8.00
Condition only when the quantity is more than one-half but not more than a full car or truck lot-----	10.00
When not more than one-half car or truck lot-----	7.00

For mixed loads.

When a car or truck contains two products each comprising one-half of a car or trucklot; \$8.00 each or-----	\$ 16.00
For condition only; \$7.00 each or-----	14.00
When a car or trucklot consists of two products and one comprises more than one-half car or trucklot, the fee shall be \$12.00 for the larger and \$8.00 for the smaller or-----	\$ 20.00
For condition only; \$10.00 larger & \$7.00 smaller or-----	17.00

When a car or trucklot consists of three products each
comprising less than one-half car or trucklot; \$8.00
each or-----\$ 24.00
For condition only; \$7.00 each or----- 21.00

Maximum car or trucklot fee for quality & condition-----\$ 24.00
Maximum car or trucklot fee for condition only----- 21.00

An additional charge of 8¢ per mile may be charged to each applicant
to cover cost of transportation..

The Commissioner may make inspections on an hourly basis, should it
be to the best advantage of the State and applicant; the charge shall be
\$4.50 per hour.

The Commissioner may refuse to inspect when, an account in delinquent,
the applicant objects to the inspector cutting a sufficient number of speci-
men, the applicant interferes with the inspection, in case of fraud or mis-
representation, or if it appears not to be to the best interest of the
State of West Virginia, or other.

October, 1960, and shall be in effect the 15th day of November, 1960.
