**A PROCLAMATION**

**By the Governor**

**WHEREAS**, Michael J. Angelucci II was born on February 17, 1982, in Marion County, West Virginia, the son of Michael Angelucci, Sr. and the late Dana Beveridge-Angelucci; and

**WHEREAS**, Michael Angelucci II graduated from North Marion High School where his leadership abilities began to flourish as he represented his class as Senior Class President, National Honor Society President, and Husky Hero of the Year; and

**WHEREAS**, Michael Angelucci II attended Fairmont State Pierpont and Technical College where he obtained his certification to become an Emergency Medical Technician and Paramedic, and continues to hold the title as the youngest licensed Paramedic in West Virginia; and

**WHEREAS**, Michael Angelucci II began working for Marion County Rescue Squad shortly after graduation, proudly serving the residents of Marion County for nearly 25 years, including 15 years as administrator; and

**WHEREAS**, Delegate Angelucci was elected to the West Virginia House of Delegates in 2018 and served until 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, Delegate Angelucci was awarded the title of Marion County Public Servant of the Year in 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to his mother, Delegate Angelucci was preceded in death by his maternal grandparents, Charles and Peggy Beveridge; his paternal grandfather, Joe Angelucci; his aunts, Ginger Moore, Pennie Beveridge; and uncles Jamie Beveridge, Fred Mullenax, and Bruce Muzichuck; and

**WHEREAS**, Delegate Angelucci is survived by his companion of 24 years, Keith Self; his stepmother, Kimberly Angelucci; a sister, Melissa Angelucci; a stepsister, Haleigh (Lee) Curtis; his paternal grandmother, Rosemary Angelucci; step-grandmother, Sharon Gump; his father and mother-in-law, Larry and Janna Self; brother-in-law, Kevin Self; two nieces, Raelynn and Remi Curtis; his best friend, Larette Woodrum; his beloved fur baby, Henry; and many aunts, uncles, and cousins; and

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of the State of West Virginia, friends, and associates of Delegate Michael J. Angelucci II desire to recognize his dedicated public service to the Great State of West Virginia and to acknowledge his valuable contributions to the State.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, PATRICK MORRISEY**, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, do hereby **ORDER** that, in commemoration of the distinguished life and service of West Virginia Delegate Michael J. Angelucci II, the United States and West Virginia State flags displayed at the Capitol Complex in Charleston, West Virginia, and at all State facilities throughout Marion County, West Virginia, shall be lowered to half-staff from dawn to dusk on January 27, 2025, the day of services celebrating his life.
