## by Governor Patrick Morrisey

**Whereas,** because firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical services workers, and 911 telecommunicators are on-call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, it is fitting to set aside a day to honor their dedication to their communities and their state; and

**Whereas,** these volunteers and professionals make numerous sacrifices and give valuable time and energy to ensure that they are properly trained and knowledgeable within their volunteer and professional lives; and

**Whereas,** firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical services workers, and 911 telecommunicators must frequently leave family, friends, and the safety of their surroundings to save a life, protect property, and prevent disasters from spreading; and

**Whereas,** we recognize the men and women who serve today throughout the Great State of West Virginia.

**Now, Therefore,** Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *September 13, 2025*, as:

## *Heroes Day*

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this annual observance by recognizing and acknowledging the impact firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical services workers, and 911 telecommunicators have on our lives.
