## by Governor Patrick Morrisey

- Whereas,** first responders are integral to every community across America, showcasing bravery, courage, and dedication when risking their safety in the execution of their duties to protect us every day; and
- Whereas,** first responders are the first line of defense, protecting the public against all threats, both domestic and foreign; and
- Whereas,** first responders are ready to aid the people of West Virginia, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; and
- Whereas,** the daily sacrifices that first responders and their families make have an inspirational and enduring impact on all communities across the country.

**Now, Therefore,** Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *October 28, 2025*, as:

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join in this observance.
