- Whereas,** pollinator species such as birds and insects are essential partners of farmers and ranchers in producing much of our food supply; and
- Whereas,** pollination plays a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands, which provide forage, fish and wildlife, timber, water, mineral resources, and recreational opportunities, as well as enhanced economic development opportunities for communities; and
- Whereas,** pollinator species provide significant environmental benefits that are necessary for maintaining healthy, biodiverse ecosystems; and
- Whereas,** the State of West Virginia has managed wildlife habitats and public lands such as forests and grasslands for decades; and
- Whereas,** a variety of state and federal programs provide producers with conservation assistance to promote wise conservation stewardship, including the protection and maintenance of pollinators and their habitats on working lands and wildlands.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *June 22-28, 2026*, as:

West Virginia Pollinator Week

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
