

Proclamation

by Governor Patrick Morrisey

- Whereas,** Lasagna Love is a national kindness movement through which more than 80,000 volunteers across all 50 states have delivered over 600,000 lasagnas to nearly 2.7 million people, building neighbor-to-neighbor connection and community across the country; and
- Whereas,** West Virginia volunteers advance Lasagna Love's mission in communities across the Mountain State, embodying the neighborly generosity for which West Virginias are known; and
- Whereas,** Lasagna Love holds that every person deserves to feel seen, valued and connected and that this connection is most powerfully created not by institutions, but by neighbors choosing to care for one another; and
- Whereas,** West Virginia's culture of community, hard work, and neighbor-to-neighbor solidarity is expressed in the mission and daily practice of Lasagna Love; and
- Whereas,** July 29 is observed nationally as Lasagna Love Day, celebrating the volunteers whose commitment to community is measured one home-cooked meal at a time.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *July 29, 2026*, as:

Lasagna Love Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance.
